2	relating to emergency shelter and care for minors.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 32.201, Family Code, is amended to read
5	as follows:
6	Sec. 32.201. EMERGENCY SHELTER <u>OR CARE</u> FOR <u>MINORS</u> [MINOR
7	MOTHERS]. (a) An emergency shelter facility may provide shelter
8	and care to a minor and the minor's child or children, if any
9	[mother who is the sole financial support of her child or children].
10	(b) An emergency shelter facility may provide shelter or
11	care only during an emergency constituting an immediate danger to
12	the physical health or safety of the minor <u>or the minor's</u> [mother or
13	her] child or children.
14	(c) Shelter or care provided under this section may not be
15	provided after the 15th day after the date the shelter or care is
16	commenced unless:
17	(1) the facility receives consent to continue services
18	from [a parent or guardian of] the minor <u>in accordance with Section</u>
19	<u>32.202</u> [mother]; or
20	(2) the minor [mother] has qualified for <u>financial</u>
21	assistance [Aid to Families with Dependent Children] under Chapter
22	31, Human Resources Code, and is on the waiting list for housing
23	assistance.
24	SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 32, Family Code, is

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1	amended by adding Section 32.202 to read as follows:
2	Sec. 32.202. CONSENT TO EMERGENCY SHELTER OR CARE BY MINOR.
3	(a) A minor may consent to emergency shelter or care to be provided
4	to the minor or the minor's child or children, if any, under Section
5	32.201(c) if the minor is:
6	(1) 16 years of age or older and:
7	(A) resides separate and apart from the minor's
8	parent, managing conservator, or guardian, regardless of whether
9	the parent, managing conservator, or guardian consents to the
10	residence and regardless of the duration of the residence; and
11	(B) manages the minor's own financial affairs,
12	regardless of the source of income; or
13	(2) unmarried and is pregnant or is the parent of a
14	child.
15	(b) Consent by a minor to emergency shelter or care under
16	this section is not subject to disaffirmance because of minority.
17	(c) An emergency shelter facility may, with or without the
18	consent of the minor's parent, managing conservator, or guardian,
19	provide emergency shelter or care to the minor or the minor's child
20	or children under Section 32.201(c).
21	(d) An emergency shelter facility is not liable for
22	providing emergency shelter or care to the minor or the minor's
23	child or children if the minor consents as provided by this section,
24	except that the facility is liable for the facility's own acts of
25	negligence.
26	(e) An emergency shelter facility may rely on the minor's
27	written statement containing the grounds on which the minor has

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capacity to consent to emergency shelter or care. 1 2 (f) To the extent of any conflict between this section and Section 32.003, Section 32.003 prevails. 3 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an emergency shelter facility that provides emergency shelter or 5 care to a minor on or after the effective date of this Act. 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 11
