A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to emergency shelter and care for minors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 32.201, Family Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 32.201. EMERGENCY SHELTER OR CARE FOR MINORS [MINOR
- 7 MOTHERS]. (a) An emergency shelter facility may provide shelter
- 8 and care to a minor and the minor's child or children, if any
- 9 [mother who is the sole financial support of her child or children].
- 10 (b) An emergency shelter facility may provide shelter or
- 11 care only during an emergency constituting an immediate danger to
- 12 the physical health or safety of the minor or the minor's [mother or
- 13 her] child or children.
- 14 (c) Shelter or care provided under this section may not be
- 15 provided after the 15th day after the date the shelter or care is
- 16 commenced unless:
- 17 (1) the facility receives consent to continue services
- 18 from [a parent or guardian of] the minor in accordance with Section
- 19 32.202 [mother]; or
- 20 (2) the minor [mother] has qualified for <u>financial</u>
- 21 assistance [Aid to Families with Dependent Children] under Chapter
- 22 31, Human Resources Code, and is on the waiting list for housing
- 23 assistance.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 32, Family Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 32.202 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 32.202. CONSENT TO EMERGENCY SHELTER OR CARE BY MINOR.
- 3 (a) A minor may consent to emergency shelter or care to be provided
- 4 to the minor or the minor's child or children, if any, under Section
- 5 32.201(c) if the minor is:
- 6 <u>(1) 16 years of age or older and:</u>
- 7 (A) resides separate and apart from the minor's
- 8 parent, managing conservator, or guardian, regardless of whether
- 9 the parent, managing conservator, or guardian consents to the
- 10 <u>residence and regardless of the duration of the residence; and</u>
- 11 (B) manages the minor's own financial affairs,
- 12 regardless of the source of income;
- 13 (2) unmarried and pregnant; or
- 14 (3) unmarried, is the parent of a child, and has actual
- 15 custody of the child.
- (b) Consent by a minor to emergency shelter or care under
- 17 this section is not subject to disaffirmance because of minority.
- 18 (c) An emergency shelter facility may, with or without the
- 19 consent of the minor's parent, managing conservator, or guardian,
- 20 provide emergency shelter or care to the minor or the minor's child
- 21 or children under Section 32.201(c).
- 22 (d) An emergency shelter facility may, with or without the
- 23 minor's consent, advise the minor's parent, managing conservator,
- or guardian of the emergency shelter or care provided to the minor.
- (e) An emergency shelter facility is not liable for
- 26 providing emergency shelter or care to the minor or the minor's
- 27 child or children if the minor consents as provided by this section,

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- 1 except that the facility is liable for the facility's own acts of
- 2 <u>negligence</u>.
- 3 (f) An emergency shelter facility may rely on the minor's
- 4 written statement containing the grounds on which the minor has
- 5 capacity to consent to emergency shelter or care.
- 6 (g) To the extent of any conflict between this section and
- 7 Section 32.003, Section 32.003 prevails.
- 8 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 9 an emergency shelter facility that provides emergency shelter or
- 10 care to a minor on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
