- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 502.409, Transportation

- 8 [UNCLEAN] LICENSE PLATE.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 502.409(a), Transportation Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person commits an offense if the person attaches to or
- 12 displays on a motor vehicle a number plate or registration insignia

- (1) is assigned to a different motor vehicle;
- 15 (2) is assigned to the vehicle under any other motor
- vehicle law other than by the department;
- 17 (3) is assigned for a registration period other than

- 20 (5) has letters, numbers, or other identification
- 21 marks that because of blurring or reflective matter are not plainly

- 11 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 13 Act. For the purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 14 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 15 occurs before that date.
- 16 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 17 Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
