A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of barbers and cosmetologists by the 3 Texas Commission on Barbering and Cosmetology and the abolition of the State Board of Barber Examiners and the Texas Cosmetology 4 5 Commission. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 7 SECTION 1. Title 9, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Chapter 1603 to read as follows: 8 CHAPTER 1603. TEXAS COMMISSION ON BARBERING AND COSMETOLOGY 9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 10 Sec. 1603.001. GENERAL DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 11 (1) "<u>Commission" means the Texas Commission</u> 12 on 13 Barbering and Cosmetology. 14 (2) "Executive director" means the executive director 15 of the commission. 16 Sec. 1603.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas Commission on Barbering and Cosmetology is subject to Chapter 325, 17 18 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the commission is abolished and this 19 chapter, Chapter 1601, and Chapter 1602 expire September 1, 2015. 20 21 [Sections 1603.003-1603.050 reserved for expansion] 22 SUBCHAPTER B. TEXAS COMMISSION ON BARBERING AND COSMETOLOGY 23 Sec. 1603.051. COMMISSION; MEMBERSHIP. (a) The Texas 24 Commission on Barbering and Cosmetology consists of 15 members

1	appointed by the governor as follows:
2	(1) five members who hold licenses issued under
3	Chapter 1601, one of whom must hold a Class A barber license, one of
4	whom must own a barbershop, and one of whom must own a barber
5	<pre>school;</pre>
6	(2) five members who hold licenses issued under
7	Chapter 1602, one of whom must hold an operator license, one of whom
8	must own a beauty or specialty shop, and one of whom must own a
9	private beauty culture school; and
10	(3) five public members.
11	(b) For the purposes of Section 1603.154 only, the executive
12	director of the Texas Workforce Commission or that official's
13	designee is an ex officio member of the commission with voting
14	privileges.
15	(c) Appointments to the commission shall be made without
16	regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
17	national origin of the appointees.
18	Sec. 1603.052. PUBLIC MEMBER ELIGIBILITY. A person may not
19	be a public member of the commission if the person or the person's
20	spouse:
21	(1) is registered, certified, or licensed by a
22	regulatory agency in the field of barbering or cosmetology;
23	(2) is employed by or participates in the management
24	of a business entity or other organization regulated by or
25	receiving money from the commission;
26	(3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
27	than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other

1 organization regulated by or receiving money from the commission; 2 or

3 <u>(4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible</u> 4 goods, services, or money from the commission, other than 5 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for commission 6 membership, attendance, or expenses.

Sec. 1603.053. MEMBERSHIP AND EMPLOYEE RESTRICTIONS. (a)
In this section, "Texas trade association" means a cooperative and
voluntarily joined association of business or professional
competitors in this state designed to assist its members and its
industry or profession in dealing with mutual business or
professional problems and in promoting their common interest.

13 (b) A person may not be a member of the commission and may 14 not be a commission employee employed in a "bona fide executive, 15 administrative, or professional capacity," as that phrase is used 16 for purposes of establishing an exemption to the overtime 17 provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 18 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments, if:

19 (1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid 20 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of barbering or 21 cosmetology; or

22 (2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid 23 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of barbering or 24 cosmetology.

25 (c) A person may not be a member of the commission or act as 26 the general counsel to the commission if the person is required to 27 register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305, Government Code, because

1	of the person's activities for compensation on behalf of a
2	profession related to the operation of the commission.
3	Sec. 1603.054. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Commission members
4	serve staggered six-year terms, with the terms of five members
5	expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
6	(b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the governor
7	shall appoint a replacement to fill the unexpired term.
8	Sec. 1603.055. GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL. (a) It is a ground for
9	removal from the commission that a member:
10	(1) does not have at the time of taking office the
11	qualifications required by Section 1603.051;
12	(2) does not maintain during service on the commission
13	the qualifications required by Section 1603.051;
14	(3) is ineligible for membership under Section
15	1603.052 or 1603.053;
16	(4) cannot, because of illness or disability,
17	discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the member's
18	term; or
19	(5) is absent from more than half of the regularly
20	scheduled commission meetings that the member is eligible to attend
21	during a calendar year without an excuse approved by a majority
22	vote of the commission.
23	(b) The validity of an action of the commission is not
24	affected by the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a
25	commission member exists.
26	(c) If the executive director has knowledge that a potential
27	ground for removal exists, the executive director shall notify the

1	presiding officer of the commission of the potential ground. The
2	presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney
3	general that a potential ground for removal exists. If the
4	potential ground for removal involves the presiding officer, the
5	executive director shall notify the next highest ranking officer of
6	the commission, who shall then notify the governor and the attorney
7	general that a potential ground for removal exists.
8	Sec. 1603.056. PRESIDING OFFICER. The governor shall
9	designate a member of the commission as the presiding officer of the
10	commission to serve in that capacity at the will of the governor.
11	Sec. 1603.057. COMMISSION MEMBER TRAINING. (a) A person
12	who is appointed to and qualifies for office as a member of the
13	commission may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in
14	attendance at a meeting of the commission until the person
15	completes a training program that complies with this section.
16	(b) The training program must provide the person with
17	information regarding:
18	(1) this chapter and Chapters 1601 and 1602;
19	(2) the programs operated by the commission;
20	(3) the role and functions of the commission;
21	(4) the rules of the commission, with an emphasis on
22	the rules that relate to disciplinary and investigatory authority;
23	(5) the current budget for the commission;
24	(6) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
25	<pre>commission;</pre>
26	(7) the requirements of:
27	(A) the open meetings law, Chapter 551,

1 Government Code; 2 (B) the public information law, Chapter 552, 3 Government Code; 4 (C) the administrative procedure law, Chapter 5 2001, Government Code; and 6 (D) other laws relating to public officials, 7 including conflict-of-interest laws; and (8) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the 8 9 commission or the Texas Ethics Commission. (c) A person appointed to the commission is entitled to 10 reimbursement, as provided by the General Appropriations Act, for 11 12 the travel expenses incurred in attending the training program regardless of whether the attendance at the program occurs before 13 14 or after the person qualifies for office. [Sections 1603.058-1603.100 reserved for expansion] 15 SUBCHAPTER C. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND PERSONNEL 16 17 Sec. 1603.101. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND OTHER PERSONNEL. (a) The commission may employ an executive director. 18 19 (b) The executive director may hire other personnel as necessary to implement this chapter. 20 21 Sec. 1603.102. DIVISION OF RESPONSIBILITIES. The commission shall develop and implement policies that clearly 22 separate the policy-making responsibilities of the commission and 23 24 the management responsibilities of the executive director and staff 25 of the commission. 26 Sec. 1603.103. QUALIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT 27 INFORMATION. The executive director or the executive director's

1	designee shall provide to members of the commission and to agency
2	employees, as often as necessary, information regarding the
3	requirements for office or employment under this chapter, including
4	information regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable
5	laws relating to standards of conduct for state officers or
6	employees.
7	Sec. 1603.104. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY POLICY;
8	REPORT. (a) The executive director or the executive director's
9	designee shall prepare and maintain a written policy statement that
10	implements a program of equal employment opportunity to ensure that
11	all personnel decisions are made without regard to race, color,
12	disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin.
13	(b) The policy statement must include:
14	(1) personnel policies, including policies relating
15	to recruitment, evaluation, selection, training, and promotion of
16	personnel, that show the intent of the commission to avoid the
17	unlawful employment practices described by Chapter 21, Labor Code;
18	and
19	(2) an analysis of the extent to which the composition
20	of the commission's personnel is in accordance with state and
21	federal law and a description of reasonable methods to achieve
22	compliance with state and federal law.
23	(c) The policy statement must:
24	(1) be updated annually;
25	(2) be reviewed by the Commission on Human Rights for
26	compliance with Subsection (b)(1); and
27	(3) be filed with the governor's office.

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1	Sec. 1603.105. TRAINING FOR EMPLOYEES ON STATE INCENTIVE
2	PROGRAM. The executive director or the executive director's
3	designee shall provide to agency employees information and training
4	on the benefits and methods of participation in the state employee
5	incentive program under Subchapter B, Chapter 2108, Government
6	<u>Code.</u>
7	[Sections 1603.106-1603.150 reserved for expansion]
8	SUBCHAPTER D. COMMISSION POWERS AND DUTIES
9	Sec. 1603.151. RULES. The commission shall adopt rules
10	consistent with this chapter for:
11	(1) the administration of this chapter and the
12	operation of the commission;
13	(2) the administration of Chapter 1601; and
14	(3) the administration of Chapter 1602.
15	Sec. 1603.152. FEES. The commission shall adopt
16	application, examination, licensing, and renewal fees in amounts
17	that are reasonable and necessary to provide sufficient revenue to
18	cover the costs of administering the programs under the authority
19	of the commission. The fees set by the commission may be adjusted
20	so that the total fees collected are sufficient to meet the expenses
21	of administering the commission's responsibilities.
22	Sec. 1603.153. BARBERS. (a) In administering Chapter 1601,
23	only the public members, the ex officio member, and the five members
24	appointed under Section 1603.051(a)(1) may adopt rules or
25	participate in disciplinary proceedings under this chapter.
26	(b) The presence of six of those members is required for a
27	quorum under this section.

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1	Sec. 1603.154. COSMETOLOGISTS. (a) In administering
2	Chapter 1602, only the public members, the ex officio member, and
3	the five members appointed under Section 1603.051(a)(2) may adopt
4	rules or participate in disciplinary proceedings under this
5	chapter.
6	(b) The presence of six of those members is required for a
7	quorum under this section.
8	[Sections 1603.155-1603.200 reserved for expansion]
9	SUBCHAPTER E. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND COMPLAINT PROCEDURES
10	Sec. 1603.201. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. The commission shall
11	develop and implement policies that provide the public with a
12	reasonable opportunity to appear before the commission and to speak
13	on any issue under the jurisdiction of the commission.
14	Sec. 1603.202. COMPLAINTS. (a) The commission shall
15	maintain a file on each written complaint filed with the
16	commission. The file must include:
17	(1) the name of the person who filed the complaint;
18	(2) the date the complaint is received by the
19	<pre>commission;</pre>
20	(3) the subject matter of the complaint;
21	(4) the name of each person contacted in relation to
22	the complaint;
23	(5) a summary of the results of the review or
24	investigation of the complaint; and
25	(6) an explanation of the reason the file was closed,
26	if the commission closed the file without taking action other than
27	to investigate the complaint.

H.B. No. 1403 (b) The commission shall provide to the person filing the 1 2 complaint and to each person who is a subject of the complaint a copy of the commission's policies and procedures relating to 3 4 complaint investigation and resolution. (c) The commission, at least quarterly until final 5 6 disposition of the complaint, shall notify the person filing the complaint and each person who is a subject of the complaint of the 7 status of the investigation unless the notice would jeopardize an 8 9 undercover investigation. SECTION 2. 1 (A) a physician or registered nurse licensed in 2 this state and operating within the scope of the person's license; 3 a commissioned or authorized medical or (B) 4 surgical officer of the United States armed forces; 5 (C) a person regulated under Chapter 1602, if the 6 person practices within the scope of a license or certificate issued by the commission under that chapter [Texas Cosmetology 7 Commission]; or 8 an inmate in the institutional division of 9 (D) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice who performs barbering 10 during the person's incarceration. 11 SECTION 4. Section 1601.151, Occupations Code, is amended 12 to read as follows: 13 GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION 14 Sec. 1601.151. 15 [BOARD]. (a) The commission [board] shall maintain an office in Austin. 16 17 (b) The commission [board] shall adopt rules for the transaction of the commission's [board's] business. 18 The commission [board] shall adopt a seal for the 19 (c) authentication of its orders, certificates, and records. 20 21 The <u>commission</u> [board] may: (d) (1) adopt and enforce all rules necessary for the 22 performance of its duties under this chapter; 23 24 (2) establish standards of conduct and ethics for 25 persons practicing under this chapter; and 26 (3) regulate any area of the practice or teaching of barbering to implement the purposes and intent of this chapter, or 27

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1 to ensure strict compliance with and enforcement of this chapter.

2 (e) The <u>commission</u> [board] by rule may define any term
3 necessary to administer or enforce this chapter.

4 SECTION 5. Section 1601.152, Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 1601.152. SANITATION RULES. (a) The <u>commission</u> 7 [board] shall adopt reasonable rules on sanitation for the 8 operation of barbershops, specialty shops, and barber schools.

9 (b) The executive director of the <u>commission</u> [board] shall 10 send a copy of the rules to each barber, barber school, or license 11 holder.

SECTION 6. Section 1601.153, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 Sec. 1601.153. RULES RESTRICTING ADVERTISING OR 15 COMPETITIVE BIDDING. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] may not adopt 16 rules restricting advertising or competitive bidding by a person 17 regulated by the <u>commission under this chapter</u> [board] except to 18 prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive practices by that person.

(b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may not include in its rules to
prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive practices by a person
regulated by the <u>commission under this chapter</u> [board] a rule that:

(1) restricts the use of any advertising medium;

(2) restricts the person's personal appearance or theuse of the person's voice in an advertisement;

25 (3) relates to the size or duration of an 26 advertisement by the person; or

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(4) restricts the use of a trade name in advertising by

1 the person.

2 SECTION 7. Section 1601.154, Occupations Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

<u>commission</u> [board] may enter and inspect at any time during

7 (1) any barbershop, specialty shop, or barber school; 8 or

9 (2) any place in which the <u>commission</u> [board] has 10 probable cause to believe that any certificate, license, or permit 11 holder is practicing illegally.

(b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may inspect the premises of a certificate, license, or permit holder to investigate a complaint at any time during business hours on receipt of a formal written complaint that a person holding a certificate, license, or permit has violated this chapter.

SECTION 8. Section 1601.155, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1601.155. AUTHORITY TO SET FEES. The <u>commission</u> [board] by rule shall set fees required by this chapter in amounts necessary to cover the costs of administering the programs to which the fees relate.

25 Sec. 1601.156. <u>COMMISSION</u> [BOARD] RECORDS. (a) The 26 <u>commission</u> [board] shall keep a record of its proceedings relating 27 to the issuance, refusal, renewal, suspension, and revocation of

1 certificates, licenses, or permits.

2 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall include in the record the 3 name, residence address, and business address of each Class A 4 barber and license or permit holder and the date and number of the 5 certificate, license, or permit.

6 (c) The record is open to public inspection at all 7 reasonable times.

No. 1403 [board-approved] training program consisting of 600 hours of 1 instruction in manicuring; and 2 (4) 3 submit a \$10 administration fee with the 4 application. 5 (c) The commission [board] shall issue a manicurist license 6 to an applicant who: 7 (1)possesses qualifications described the by 8 Subsection (b); 9 (2) passes the appropriate examination; pays a license fee not to exceed \$30; and 10 (3) (4) has not committed an act that is a ground for 11 denial of a license. 12 SECTION 16. Section 1601.260, Occupations Code, is amended 13 14 to read as follows: 15 Sec. 1601.260. ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDENT PERMIT. (a) An applicant for a permit to be a student in a barber school must: 16 17 (1) submit an enrollment application to the commission [board] in the form prescribed by the commission [board]; 18 have completed the seventh grade; 19 (2) satisfy other requirements specified by 20 (3) the 21 commission [board]; and 22 (4) submit with the application a nonrefundable application fee in an amount not to exceed \$25. 23 24 (b) A separate application is required for each enrollment, 25 reenrollment, or transfer enrollment. The application fee applies only to the first enrollment. The commission [board] may not charge 26 the application fee for any later enrollment, reenrollment, or 27

8 (1) two photographs of the applicant, one of which 9 accompanies the application and one of which is to be returned to 10 the applicant to be presented at the examination; and

Α commission [board] inspector may administer an examination under 7 8 this subsection at barber schools throughout the state.

9 (d) An examination may not be held at a barber school or 10 barbershop owned, managed, or operated by a <u>commission</u> [board] 11 member.

SECTION 19. Section 1601.263, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1601.263. EXAMINATION RESULTS. 14 (a) The commission 15 [board] shall notify each examinee of the results of the examination not later than the 30th day after the date an 16 17 examination is administered. If an examination is graded or reviewed by a national testing service, the commission [board] 18 shall notify each examinee of the results of the examination not 19 later than the 14th day after the date the commission [board] 20 receives the results from the testing service. 21

(b) If the notice of examination results graded or reviewed by a national testing service will be delayed for longer than 90 days after the examination date, the <u>commission</u> [board] shall notify each examinee of the reason for the delay before the 90th day.

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(c) If requested in writing by a person who fails the

examination, the <u>commission</u> [board] shall furnish the person with
 an analysis of the person's performance on the examination.

5 Sec. 1601.264. HEALTH CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENT. The 6 <u>commission</u> [board] may not issue a certificate or license until an 7 applicant presents a health certificate from a physician stating 8 that the applicant does not have an infectious or contagious 9 disease.

10 SECTION 21. Section 1601.265, Occupations Code, is amended 11 to read as follows:

Sec. 1601.265. WAIVER OF LICENSE REQUIREMENTS; PERSONAL INTERVIEW. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] may waive any license requirement for an applicant holding a license from another state or country that has license requirements substantially equivalent to those of this state.
