## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the landward boundary of the public beach when natural
- 3 dune vegetation is planted and becomes established at a beach
- 4 renourishment project.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 61.017, Natural Resources Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 8 Section 61.017. Line of Vegetation Unaffected by Certain
- 9 Conditions
- 10 (e) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b) of this
- 11 section, a beach renourishment project which entails planting of
- 12 native dune vegetation can be undertaken to restore the public
- 13 beach and re-establish the line of vegetation. Such beach
- 14 renourishment projects for the purposes of this subsection can only
- be undertaken by federal, state, or local government entities, or
- 16 by a private entity in partnership with one or more government
- 17 entities. Sand used in such beach renourishment projects shall
- 18 have the same grain size and mineralogy as the surrounding beach
- 19 area. Upon completion of the renourishment project and
- 20 <u>re-establishment of the planted native vegetation</u>, the landward
- 21 boundary of the public beach will be the line of newly established
- 22 planted vegetation.
