12	(B) was eligible to retire from a law enforcement
13	agency or was ineligible to retire only as a result of an injury
14	received in the course of the officer's employment with the agency;

16	(C) is entitled to receive a pension or annuity
17	for service as a law enforcement officer or is not entitled to
18	receive a pension or annuity only because the law enforcement
19	agency that employed the officer does not offer a pension or annuity
20	to its employees.
21	(2) "Informant" [, "informant"] means a person who has
22	communicated information to the government in connection with any

(3) "Public servant" includes an honorably retired

- 2 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 3 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 4 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 5 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 6 before the effective date.
- 7 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 8 Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 9 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
