- deposit $[\frac{\text{them}}{\text{m}}]$ in the county clerk's office: 15 (2) pay a \$15 fee to the county clerk for storage of 16
- 17 the records and papers; and (3) surrender to the county clerk the notary's seal of 18
- office. 19 (b) The county clerk shall deposit a fee collected under 20

this section to the credit of the general fund of the county.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 24
