10	an offense if the person possesses a glass container within the
11	boundaries of a state-owned riverbed. An offense under this

an offense under this section, in which case the offense is a Class
B misdemeanor.

(b) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a) that

section is a Class C misdemeanor unless it is shown on the trial of

- the person who possessed the glass container:
- 18 <u>(1) did not transport the glass container into the</u>
 19 boundaries of the riverbed; and
- 20 (2) possessed the glass container only for the purpose
 21 of lawfully disposing of the glass container in a designated waste
 22 receptacle.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
