## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	

- 2 relating to the creation and operation of the advisory committee on
- 3 health care coverage issues.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 21, Insurance Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Article 21.51 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 21.51. ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE COVERAGE
- 8 ISSUES
- 9 Sec. 1. DEFINITIONS. In this article:
- 10 (1) "Advisory committee" means the advisory committee
- 11 on health care coverage issues.
- 12 (2) "Health care practitioner" means an individual who
- is licensed or otherwise regulated by this state to provide health
- 14 care services.
- 15 (3) "Health insurer" means an insurance company, group
- 16 hospital service corporation, or other entity authorized to engage
- in the business of health insurance in this state that delivers or
- 18 <u>issues for delivery an individual, group, blanket, or franchise</u>
- 19 insurance policy or insurance agreement or group hospital service
- 20 contract that provides benefits for medical or surgical expenses
- 21 incurred as a result of an accident or sickness.
- 22 (4) "Health maintenance organization" has the meaning
- 23 assigned by the Texas Health Maintenance Organization Act (Chapter
- 24 20A, Vernon's Texas Insurance Code).

- 1 Sec. 2. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The advisory committee on
- 2 health care coverage issues consists of 15 members appointed by the
- 3 commissioner as follows:
- 4 (1) three members who are representatives of health
- 5 insurers;
- 6 (2) three members who are representatives of health
- 7 maintenance organizations;
- 8 (3) three members who are physicians licensed by the
- 9 Texas State Board of Medical Examiners to practice medicine in this
- 10 <u>state;</u>
- 11 (4) three members who are health care practitioners
- 12 other than physicians; and
- 13 (5) three public members.
- 14 (b) Appointments to the advisory committee shall be made
- 15 without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age,
- or national origin of the appointees.
- 17 (c) Members of the advisory committee serve at the pleasure
- 18 of the commissioner.
- 19 (d) The advisory committee is not subject to Section
- 20 2110.008, Government Code.
- Sec. 3. ELIGIBILITY OF MEMBERS. (a) A person is not
- 22 eligible for appointment as a public member of the advisory
- 23 committee if the person or the person's spouse:
- 24 (1) is registered, certified, or licensed by the
- department or by a regulatory agency in the field of health care;
- 26 (2) is employed by or participates in the management
- 27 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or

- 1 receiving money from the department or a regulatory agency in the
- 2 field of health care;
- 3 (3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
- 4 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 5 organization regulated by or receiving money from the department or
- 6 <u>a regulatory agency in the field of health care; or</u>
- 7 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 8 goods, services, or money from the department or a regulatory
- 9 agency in the field of health care other than compensation or
- 10 <u>reimbursement authorized by law.</u>
- 11 (b) A person may not be a member of the advisory committee if
- the person is required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305,
- 13 Government Code, because of the person's activities for
- 14 compensation on behalf of a profession related to the operation of
- the department or a regulatory agency in the field of health care.
- Sec. 4. TERMS. Members of the advisory committee serve
- 17 staggered six-year terms, with the terms of five members expiring
- on February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
- 19 <u>Sec. 5. PRESIDING OFFICER; MEETINGS.</u> (a) The commissioner
- 20 shall appoint the presiding officer of the advisory committee to
- 21 serve in that capacity for one year.
- 22 (b) The advisory committee shall meet quarterly and at the
- 23 call of the commissioner.
- Sec. 6. REIMBURSEMENT OF MEMBER'S EXPENSES. A member of the
- 25 advisory committee may not receive compensation for serving on the
- 26 advisory committee. A member is eligible for reimbursement for
- 27 expenses incurred in performing advisory committee functions only

- 1 <u>as provided by Section 2110.004, Government Code.</u>
- 2 Sec. 7. DUTIES; REPORTS. (a) The advisory committee shall
- 3 study health care coverage problems in this state and make
- 4 recommendations to the commissioner and the legislature about
- 5 practical and efficient solutions to those problems. In conducting
- 6 the study, the advisory committee shall examine:
- 7 (1) the benefits provided in this state under health
- 8 insurance policies and evidences of coverage;
- 9 (2) issues regarding payment of physicians and health
- 10 care practitioners by health insurers and health maintenance
- 11 organizations;
- 12 (3) consumer concerns regarding health care coverage;
- 13 and
- 14 (4) other issues as specified by the commissioner.
- 15 (b) The advisory committee shall report to the commissioner
- 16 at least quarterly and as directed by the commissioner.
- 17 (c) The advisory committee shall report to the legislature
- during each regular legislative session in the manner prescribed by
- 19 the commissioner. The report to the legislature may include
- 20 recommendations for proposed legislation.
- 21 SECTION 2. The commissioner of insurance shall appoint the
- 22 initial members of the advisory committee on health care coverage
- issues established under Article 21.51, Insurance Code, as added by
- 24 this Act, not later than the 30th day after the effective date of
- 25 this Act.
- 26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
