Section 43.033, Local Government Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 7 (a) A general-law municipality may annex adjacent territory 8 without the consent of any of the residents or voters of the area 9 and without the consent of any of the owners of land in the area 10 provided that the following conditions are met: 11 12 (1) the municipality has a population of 1,000 or more 13 and is not eligible to adopt a home-rule charter; 14 (2) the procedural rules prescribed by this chapter are met; 15 (3) the municipality or another governmental entity is 16 [must be] providing the area with water or sewer service; 17 18 (4) the area does not include unoccupied territory in excess of: 19 (A) one acre for each service address for water 20 21 and sewer service; or 22 (B) five acres for each service address for water 23 and sewer service, if the municipality has a population of less than 24 2,000;

No. 1607 1 (5) the service plan requires that police and fire 2 protection at a level consistent with protection provided within 3 the municipality must be provided to the area within 10 days after 4 the effective date of the annexation; and 5 (6) the municipality and the affected landowners have 6 not entered an agreement to not annex the area for a certain time 7 period. 8 (c) A general-law municipality may annex an area adjacent to 9 the municipality without the consent of any of the residents or voters of the area and without the consent of any of the owners of 10 land in the area if: 11 (1) the area is owned by a governmental entity; 12 (2) each property in the area is adjacent to property 13 in the boundaries of the municipality that is owned by the same 14 15 person as the person who owns the property in the area; or 16 (3) one or more municipalities surround more than 65 17 percent of the perimeter of the area. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 18
