4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 2306.6710(b), Government Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(b) If an application satisfies the threshold criteria, the
8	department shall score and rank the application using a point
9	system that:
10	(1) prioritizes in descending order criteria [based on
11	criteria that are adapted to regional market conditions and adopted
12	by the department, including criteria:
13	[(1)] regarding:
14	(A) <u>quantifiable</u> community participation with
15	<u>respect to</u> [the income levels of tenants of] the development;
16	(B) <u>input from local and state elected officials</u>
17	[the rent levels of the units];
18	(C) <u>financial</u> feasibility of the development
19	<pre>[the period of guaranteed affordability for low income tenants];</pre>
20	(D) the size, quality, and amenities of the units
21	<pre>[cost by square foot of the development];</pre>
22	(E) the <u>income levels of tenants of the</u>
23	<pre>development [size, quality, and amenities of the units];</pre>
24	(F) the <u>rent levels of the units</u> [services to be

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provided to tenants of the development]; 1 2 (G) the period of guaranteed affordability for low income tenants [commitment of development funding by local 3 political subdivisions that enables additional units for 4 individuals and families of very low income]; [and] 5 6 (H) the cost by square foot [level of community 7 support for the application, evaluated on the basis of written statements of support from local and state elected officials 8 representing constituents in areas that include the location] of 9 10 the development; [and] (I) the services to be provided to tenants of the 11 12 development; and (J) the commitment of development funding by 13 local political subdivisions that enables additional units for 14 15 individuals and families of very low income; and uses criteria imposing penalties on applicants or 16 (2) affiliates who have requested extensions of department deadlines 17 relating to developments supported by housing tax credit 18 allocations made in the application round preceding the current 19 round. 20 21 SECTION 2. Section 2306.6717(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 22 The department shall <u>make available on the department's</u> 23 (b) 24 website [provide] information regarding the low income housing tax credit program, including notice regarding public hearings, 25 26 [board] meetings, [and] the opening and closing dates for applications, submitted applications, and applications approved 27

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H.B. No. 1632 for underwriting and recommended to the board, and shall provide 1 2 that information to: 3 (1)locally affected community groups; 4 (2) local and state elected officials; 5 local housing departments; (3) (4) any appropriate [(2)] newspapers of general or 6 limited circulation that serve the community in which the 7 8 development is to be located; 9 (5) [(3)] nonprofit organizations; 10 (6) [(4)] on-site property managers of occupied developments that are the subject of applications for posting in 11 12 prominent locations in those developments; and (7) [(5)] any other interested 13 persons and [-14 including] community groups that [, who] request the information. 15 SECTION 3. Section 2306.6710(e), Government Code, is repealed. 16 SECTION 4. Sections 2306.6725 and 2306.6732, Government 17 Code, are repealed. 18 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only 19 to a proposed development for which an application for a low income 20 housing tax credit is submitted on or after the effective date of 21 this Act. 2.2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 23 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
