imaging by way of still-image capture and store and forward; and

(C) other technology that facilitates access to 1 health care services or medical specialty expertise; 2 [(12) "Telepharmacy system" means a system that 3 monitors the dispensing of prescription drugs and provides for 4 5 related drug use review and patient counseling services by an 6 electronic method, including the use of the following types of 7 technology: [(A) audio and video; 8 9 [(B) still image capture; and [(C) store and forward. 10 SECTION 2. Section 57.045(e), Utilities Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12 (e) The board shall establish an assistance program to 13 provide education concerning the telecommunications infrastructure 14 15 fund and to facilitate access to funds and programs under this subchapter [by health care facilities and by physicians licensed to 16 practice medicine in this state]. The assistance program must 17 include a toll-free telephone number and provide access to 18 information through the Internet. 19 SECTION 3. Section 57.046(b), Utilities Code, is amended to 20 read as follows: 21 (b) The board shall use money in the qualifying entities 22 account for grants and loans to public schools or institutions of 23 higher education for any purpose authorized by this subchapter, 24 25 including: 26 (1) equipment;

- 13 date is no longer authorized under Subchapter C, Chapter 57,
- 14 Utilities Code, as amended by this Act, is denied.
- 15 (c) The telecommunications infrastructure fund board and
- 16 the comptroller may disburse money from the telecommunications
- infrastructure fund account for a grant or loan awarded before the
- 18 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 19 effect for that purpose.
