A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to student fees charged at The University of Texas at San
- 3 Antonio.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.532(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board of regents of The University of Texas System
- 8 may levy a student union fee of not less than \$20 or more than \$150
- 9 [\$75] for each semester or summer session, assessed in proportion
- 10 to the number of credit hours for which a student registers, for the
- 11 sole purpose of financing, operating, maintaining, and improving a
- 12 student union building for The University of Texas at San Antonio.
- 13 This fee may be levied in addition to any other use or service fee.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 54.543, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (g) to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (a) The board of regents of The University of Texas System
- 18 may charge each student enrolled at The University of Texas at San
- 19 Antonio a recreational facility fee not to exceed \$100 [\$30] for
- 20 each semester of the regular term or summer session to finance,
- 21 construct, operate, maintain, or improve student recreational
- 22 facilities at the university.
- 23 (g) The board may not increase the amount of the
- 24 recreational facility fee by more than 10 percent in any academic

- 1 year unless the amount of the increase is approved by a majority
- 2 vote of the students participating in a general student election
- 3 held for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to fees imposed for a semester or term that begins on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
