Section 251.07, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows: 5 Sec. 251.07. HEADING AND STATEMENT ON PETITION TO PROHIBIT. 6 7 Each page of a [The] petition for a local option election seeking to prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages of one or more of the 8 various types and alcoholic contents shall be headed "Petition for 9 Local Option Election to Prohibit." Each page of the [The] petition 10 11 shall contain a statement just ahead of the signatures of the petitioners, as follows: "It is the hope, purpose and intent of the 12 petitioners whose signatures appear hereon to see prohibited the 13 14 sale of alcoholic beverages referred to in the issue set out above." Each page of the [The] petition must clearly state the issue to be 15 voted on, and that issue must be one of those issues set out in 16 Section 251.14 of this code. 17 18 SECTION 2. Section 251.08, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows: 19 Sec. 251.08. HEADING AND STATEMENT ON PETITION TO LEGALIZE. 20 21 Each page of a [The] petition for a local option election seeking to legalize the sale of alcoholic beverages of one or more of the 22 various types and alcoholic contents shall be headed "Petition for 23

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Local Option Election to Legalize." Each page of the [The] petition

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shall contain a statement just ahead of the signatures of the petitioners, as follows: "It is the hope, purpose and intent of the petitioners whose signatures appear hereon to see legalized the sale of alcoholic beverages referred to in the issue set out above." <u>Each page of the</u> [The] petition must clearly state the issue to be voted on, and that issue must be one of those issues set out in Section 251.14 of this code.

8 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 251, Alcoholic Beverage 9 Code, is amended by adding Section 251.101 to read as follows:

10 <u>Sec. 251.101. WITHDRAWAL OF SIGNATURE. (a) A signer may</u> 11 <u>not withdraw the signature from a petition on or after the date the</u> 12 <u>petition is received by the county clerk. Before that date, a</u> 13 <u>signer may withdraw the signature by deleting the signature from</u> 14 <u>the petition or by filing with the county clerk an affidavit</u> 15 <u>requesting that the signature be withdrawn from the petition.</u>

16 (b) A withdrawal affidavit filed by mail is considered to be 17 <u>filed at the time of its receipt by the county clerk.</u>

18 (c) The withdrawal of a signature nullifies the signature on 19 the petition and places the signer in the same position as if the 20 signer had not signed the petition.

SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 251, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended by adding Sections 251.82 and 251.83 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 251.82. TRAINING FOR COUNTY ELECTION OFFICIALS. The</u> 25 <u>secretary of state shall conduct a training program for county</u> 26 <u>election officials about the requirements of this chapter.</u>
