- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1053.001, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subdivision (3) and by adding Subdivisions (4)-(6) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (3) "Interior designer" means a person who is
- 9 registered under this chapter to engage in the practice of interior
- 10 <u>design</u>. The term includes a "Registered Interior Designer."
- 11 (4) "Space planning" means the analysis and design of
- 12 spatial and occupancy requirements, including space layouts and
- 13 final planning.
- 14 (5) "Reflected ceiling plan" means a ceiling design
- that illustrates a ceiling as if it were projected downward, and may
- 16 include lighting and other elements.
- 17 (6) "Responsible supervisory control" is the direct
- 18 responsibility for supervision by an interior designer of the work
- 19 and decision-making process, including the ability to review,
- 20 <u>enforce</u>, and control compliance with all design criteria and life
- 21 safety requirements. For purposes of this subdivision, supervision
- is not required to be continuous and uninterrupted.
- 23 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Sections 1053.0011 and 1053.0012 to read as

1 follows: 2 Sec. 1053.0011. DEFINITION OF "INTERIOR DESIGN." (a) this chapter, "interior design" means the performance of 3 4 professional services for a fee or other compensation, directly or 5 indirectly, to another person, or to a partnership, corporation, or 6 other legal entity, that include: (1) preparing and filing interior design construction 7 8 documents with code enforcement officials for nonstructural or 9 nonseismic interior construction; 10 (2) obtaining building permits for nonstructural or nonseismic interior construction; 11 12 (3) preparing documents to illustrate materials, finishes, space planning, reflected ceiling plans, furnishings, 13 14 fixtures, and equipment; 15 (4) analyzing a client's needs, goals, and life safety requirements while protecting the public health, safety, and 16 17 welfare; (5) integrating findings with knowledge of interior 18 19 design; (6) formulating preliminary design concepts that are 20 21 appropriate, functional, and aesthetic; 22 (7) developing and presenting final design recommendations through appropriate presentation media; 23 24 (8) collaborating with closely allied design 25 professionals who are licensed practitioners offering professional 26 services as required for regulatory approval;

(9) preparing and administering bids and contract

1	documents as the client's agent; and
2	(10) reviewing and evaluating the implementation of
3	projects while in progress and on completion as a representative
4	of, and on behalf of, the client.
5	(b) The term does not include construction of certain
6	structural and mechanical systems, including:
7	(1) plumbing systems;
8	(2) heating, air-conditioning, and ventilation
9	systems;
10	(3) electrical systems;
11	(4) vertical transportation systems;
12	(5) fire-rated vertical shafts in multistory
13	structures;
14	(6) fire-related protection of structural elements;
15	(7) smoke evacuation and compartmentalization;
16	(8) emergency sprinkler systems; and
17	(9) emergency alarm systems.
18	Sec. 1053.0012. DEFINITION OF "NONSTRUCTURAL" OR
19	"NONSEISMIC"; DESCRIPTION. (a) In this chapter, "nonstructural"
20	or "nonseismic" means an interior element or component that is not
21	load-bearing or does not assist in the seismic design of a structure
22	and does not require computations for a building's structure. The
23	term does not include the structural frame system supporting a
24	building.
25	(b) Common nonstructural elements or components include
26	ceiling and partition systems that employ normal and typical
27	bracing conventions and are not part of the structural integrity of

- 1 the building.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 1053.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1053.002. APPLICATION. (a) This chapter does not
- 5 apply to a person who:
- 6 (1) does not use the title "interior designer" and
- 7 does not use the term "interior design" to describe a service the
- 8 person offers or performs; or
- 9 (2) is registered to practice architecture in this
- state, if the architect does not use the term "Registered Interior
- 11 Designer" unless also registered under this chapter.
- 12 (b) This chapter does not:
- 13 (1) prohibit an employee of a retail establishment
- 14 from providing consultations regarding interior decoration or
- 15 furnishings:
- 16 (A) on the premises of the retail establishment;
- 17 or
- 18 (B) in furtherance of a retail sale or
- 19 prospective retail sale [an interior designer or architect from
- 20 performing an interior design service under the control,
- 21 instruction, or supervision of the interior designer or architect];
- 22 [or]
- 23 (2) restrict the practice or activities of or the
- 24 provision of a service by a person engaged in a profession or
- 25 occupation for which the person is licensed or registered in this
- state under any other law; or
- 27 (3) restrict the activities of a person who provides

- 1 decorative services or assistance in the selection of surface
- 2 materials, window coverings, wall coverings, paint, floor
- 3 coverings, surface-mounted fixtures, and loose furnishings not
- 4 subject to regulation.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 1053.051, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
- 7 <u>(c) The board by rule shall establish:</u>
- 8 <u>(1)</u> the qualifications for initial and renewal
- 9 <u>certificates of registration under this chapter; and</u>
- 10 (2) standards of conduct for interior designers.
- 11 (d) The board shall administer and enforce this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 1053,
- Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 SUBCHAPTER D. REGISTRATION [REQUIREMENTS]
- SECTION 6. Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 1053.151. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. A person other than
- 18 an interior designer may not:
- 19 (1) engage in the practice of interior design or offer
- 20 or attempt to engage in the practice of interior design unless the
- 21 person is registered under this chapter; or
- (2) hold the person out as engaged in the practice of
- 23 <u>interior design or, unless all interior design services provided</u>
- 24 by the person are rendered by or under the responsible supervisory
- 25 control of a person registered under this chapter, represent:
- 26 (A) that the person is an "interior designer" by
- 27 using that title or the term "Registered Interior Designer"; or

- 1 $\underline{\text{(B)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(2)}}{\text{represent}_r}$] by using the term "interior
- design," a service the person offers or performs.
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 1053.152(b), Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) To be eligible for a certificate of registration, an
- 6 applicant must:
- 7 (1) meet the qualifications established by the board
- 8 under Subsection (a);
- 9 (2) pass the [registration] examination of the
- 10 National Council for Interior Design Qualification or a similar
- 11 <u>national organization recognized by the board; [and]</u>
- 12 (3) pay the required fees;
- 13 (4) hold a professional degree in interior design
- 14 conferred by a design program accredited by the Foundation for
- 15 Interior Design Education Research or a substantially equivalent
- 16 program, as determined by the board; and
- 17 (5) have two years of diversified experience as
- 18 determined by the board.
- 19 SECTION 8. Section 1053.154(b), Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (b) The examination must cover subjects established by and
- 22 must be graded according to board rules. The board by rule shall
- 23 [may] adopt the examination of the National Council for Interior
- 24 Design Qualification or a <u>similar national organization recognized</u>
- 25 by the board [comparable examination].
- SECTION 9. Section 1053.160, Occupations Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1053.160. [USE OF INTERIOR DESIGNER'S] SEAL. (a) On
- 2 registration, each [An] interior designer shall obtain a [is
- 3 entitled to use any seal, of a design adopted by the board, that
- 4 bears:
- 5 (1) the interior designer's name and registration
- 6 number;
- 7 (2) the words "Registered Interior Designer";
- 8 (3) the words "State of Texas"; and
- 9 <u>(4) the expiration date of the certificate of</u>
- 10 <u>registration</u>.
- 11 (b) The interior designer shall stamp or impress the seal on
- 12 each drawing or specification issued by the interior designer for
- 13 use in this state. Construction documents that bear the seal shall
- 14 be accepted for filing by the appropriate jurisdiction or local
- 15 <u>building department.</u>
- (c) A person may not use or attempt to use the seal of an
- interior designer, a similar seal, or a replica of the seal unless
- 18 the use is by or through an interior designer.
- 19 (d) An interior designer may not permit a person who is not
- 20 registered under this chapter to use the interior designer's seal
- 21 without the interior designer's personal supervision.
- 22 SECTION 10. Section 1053.161, Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1053.161. RECIPROCITY. The board may waive any
- 25 registration requirement for an applicant who:
- 26 (1) is licensed or registered to practice interior
- 27 design by another state that has licensing or registration

- 1 requirements <u>at least as stringent as</u> [<u>substantially equivalent to</u>]
- 2 the requirements of this state;
- 3 (2) is in good standing with the state that issued the
- 4 license or registration; [and]
- 5 (3) submits an application and pays an administrative
- 6 fee to the board; and
- 7 (4) holds a current certificate issued by the National
- 8 Council for Interior Design Qualification or a similar credential
- 9 recognized by the board.
- 10 SECTION 11. The heading to Section 1053.201, Occupations
- 11 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1053.201. [ANNUAL] RENEWAL REQUIRED.
- 13 SECTION 12. Section 1053.201, Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 by amending Subsection (a) and by adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a certificate of
- 17 registration issued under this chapter is valid for one year from
- 18 the date of issuance. [The board shall provide for the annual
- 19 renewal of a certificate of registration.
- 20 (c) Effective September 1, 2003, to be eligible to renew a
- 21 <u>certificate of registration</u>, an interior designer who has not
- 22 passed the examination of the National Council for Interior Design
- 23 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the
- 24 board, must:
- 25 (1) pass the building and barrier-free code section of
- 26 the examination of the National Council for Interior Design
- 27 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the

- 1 board; or
- 2 (2) complete, in addition to the continuing education
- 3 requirements required for renewal of the certificate of
- 4 registration under Section 1053.205, 15 hours of board-approved
- 5 continuing education classes relating to building and barrier-free
- 6 codes and regulations.
- 7 SECTION 13. Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1053.351. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 10 offense if the person knowingly violates [Section 1053.151 or a
- 11 standard of conduct adopted under] this chapter or a rule adopted
- 12 under this chapter.
- (b) An offense under this section is a [Class C] misdemeanor
- punishable by a fine of not less than \$250 or more than \$5,000. Each
- day of violation constitutes a separate offense.
- 16 SECTION 14. Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subchapter I to read as follows:
- 18 <u>SUBCHAPTER I. PRACTICE BY INTERIOR DESIGNER</u>
- 19 Sec. 1053.401. SUPERVISION BY INTERIOR DESIGNER. Each
- 20 interior design office must have an interior designer who is
- 21 <u>responsible for interior design work performed at that location.</u>
- 22 The interior designer shall provide responsible supervisory
- 23 control over each nonregistered person working at that location in
- 24 the practice of interior design.
- Sec. 1053.402. DUTIES TO CLIENT. Before entering into a
- 26 contract with a client, an interior designer must clearly determine
- 27 the scope and nature of the project and the method of compensation.

- 1 Sec. 1053.403. DISCLOSURE OF BOARD INFORMATION. An
- 2 interior designer shall notify each client of the name and address
- 3 of the board.
- 4 Sec. 1053.404. COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS. Each
- 5 interior designer shall practice in compliance with all applicable
- 6 building codes, fire codes, local regulations, and other safety
- 7 requirements adopted by the board or another regulatory entity
- 8 implemented to prohibit practice by persons who:
- 9 (1) fail to practice within the bounds of minimum
- 10 <u>competency requirements; or</u>
- 11 (2) otherwise present a danger to the public.
- 12 SECTION 15. Sections 1053.001(2) and 1053.158, Occupations
- 13 Code, are repealed.
- 14 SECTION 16. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners
- 15 shall issue a certificate of registration as an interior designer
- 16 to a person who applies for registration as an interior designer
- 17 with the board and pays the required fees before the second
- anniversary of the effective date of this Act if the person presents
- 19 evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has passed the
- 20 examination of the National Council for Interior Design
- 21 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the
- 22 board.
- SECTION 17. (a) The change in law made by this Act to
- 24 Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, applies only to the punishment
- 25 for an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 26 For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the
- 27 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs

- before the effective date.
- 2 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 3 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 4 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 5 purpose.
- 6 SECTION 18. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners
- 7 shall adopt rules as required by Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, as
- 8 amended by this Act, not later than December 1, 2003.
- 9 SECTION 19. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 10 applies only to an application for an initial or renewal interior
- 11 designer certificate of registration that is filed with the Texas
- 12 Board of Architectural Examiners on or after January 1, 2004. An
- application filed before January 1, 2004, is governed by the law in
- 14 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 15 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
