- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 107 to read as follows:

7 <u>CHAPTER 107. GERONTOLOGY TRAINING</u>

- 8 Sec. 107.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "health care
- 9 practitioner" means an individual who is licensed in this state to
- 10 provide health care services. The term includes a physician, a
- 11 registered nurse, a psychologist, a licensed professional
- 12 counselor, and any other license holder under this code who, in
- 13 providing health care services, provides therapy or counseling
- 14 services.
- 15 Sec. 107.002. REQUIRED TRAINING IN GERONTOLOGY; RULES;
- 16 NOTICE. (a) Each state regulatory agency that licenses health care
- 17 practitioners who, in the normal course of their professional
- 18 practice, provide health care services to elderly persons shall
- 19 require its license holders to complete training in gerontology as
- 20 <u>a condition for obtaining or renewing a license.</u>
- 21 (b) A state regulatory agency affected by this section
- 22 shall:
- 23 (1) adopt rules regarding the required gerontology
- 24 training; and

- 1 (2) notify its license holders of the requirements
- 2 <u>adopted under this chapter.</u>
- 3 Sec. 107.003. CONTINUING EDUCATION. A health care
- 4 practitioner may satisfy the requirement imposed under Section
- 5 107.002 through participation in continuing education that
- 6 includes training in gerontology.
- 7 Sec. 107.004. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. Failure by
- 8 a health care practitioner to comply with the requirements adopted
- 9 by the practitioner's state regulatory agency constitutes grounds
- 10 for disciplinary action by the agency against the practitioner in
- 11 the manner provided under the chapter under which the practitioner
- 12 is licensed.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 14 applies only to a license that is issued or renewed on or after
- 15 January 1, 2004. A license that is issued or renewed before
- 16 January 1, 2004, is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 17 license was issued or renewed, and the former law in continued in
- 18 effect for that purpose.
