A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the leasing and contracting powers of a port authority 3 or navigation district. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 60.039, Water Code, is amended to read as 6 follows: Sec. 60.039. SURFACE LEASE FOR NOT MORE THAN 30 [10] YEARS. 7 The commission may lease the surface of land for not more than 30 8 [10] years by the entry of an order on the minutes of the commission 9 and the execution of a lease in the manner provided by the original 10 11 order. The lease may not be extended beyond the 30-year [10-year] 12 period by renewal, extension, or otherwise. 13 SECTION 2. Section 60.040, Water Code, is amended to read as follows: 14 Sec. 60.040. PUBLICATION OF NOTICE FOR SALES AND LEASES IN 15 EXCESS OF 30 [10] YEARS. Before making a sale or lease of land for 16 more than 30 [10] years, the commission shall publish a notice in 17 the manner provided in Section 60.035 of this subchapter. 18 SECTION 3. Section 60.041, Water Code, is amended to read as 19 follows: 20 21 Sec. 60.041. SECURITY FOR BIDS ON LAND TO BE SOLD OR LEASED FOR MORE THAN 30 [10] YEARS. Each bid submitted on land to be sold 22

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or leased for more than 30 $[\frac{10}{10}]$ years shall be accompanied by a

certified check, cashier's check, or bidder's bond with a

responsible corporate surety authorized to do business in Texas.
The check or bond shall be in an amount equal to the bid for the land or for the first rental payment under the lease and shall guarantee that the bidder will perform the terms of his bid if it is accepted by the commission.

6 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 60.042, Water Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 60.042. AWARD AND EXECUTION OF DEED OR LEASE IN EXCESS
9 OF <u>30</u> [10] YEARS.

10 SECTION 5. Section 60.151, Water Code, is amended to read as 11 follows:

Sec. 60.151. PURPOSE. It is the purpose and intent of this subchapter to confer on districts <u>individually</u>, jointly, or mutually interested in a navigation project, including a project relating to improvements and facilities described in Sections 60.032 and 60.101 of this code, the fullest possible power of contract with regard to navigation <u>or other</u> projects of <u>individual</u> <u>or</u> common interest.

SECTION 6. Section 60.152(a), Water Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) <u>One</u> [Two] or more districts, which are interested in or
may, in the judgment of the commission, be benefited by a navigation
<u>or other</u> project, may enter into contracts with the United States or
with <u>another district</u> [cach other], or both, to consummate
navigation <u>or other</u> projects of common interest.

26 SECTION 7. Section 60.403(a), Water Code, is amended to 27 read as follows:

5	SECTION 8. Subchapter N, Chapter 60, Water Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 60.4115 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 60.4115. NOTIFICATION OF SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL
8	RECORD OF CONTRACTOR. (a) A person that enters into a contract
9	with a district or port authority shall provide, at the request of
10	the district or port authority, notice to the district or authority
11	of any citation, notice of violation or penalty, or other similar
12	document, regarding a serious safety or environmental violation
13	that the person received from an agency or department of this state
14	or of the federal government. The notice must include:
15	(1) a general description of the conduct that resulted
16	in the citation, violation, penalty, or similar sanction; and
17	(2) the document from the agency or department that
18	provided notice to the person of the citation, violation, penalty,
19	or similar sanction.
20	(b) A district or port authority may terminate a contract
21	with a person if the district or authority determines that the
22	person failed to give notice as required by Subsection (a) or
23	misrepresented conduct that resulted in a citation, notice of
24	violation or penalty, or similar sanction. The district or port
25	authority shall compensate the person for services performed before
26	the termination of the contract.
27	(c) This section applies to all purchasing methods

1 available to a district or port authority.

2 SECTION 9. (a) This Act takes effect immediately if it 3 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 4 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 5 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 6 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

7 (b) Section 60.4115, Water Code, as added by this Act, 8 applies only to a contract entered into on or after the effective 9 date of this Act. A contract entered into before the effective date 10 of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the contract 11 was entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that 12 purpose.

13 (c) The changes in law made to Sections 60.039, 60.040,
14 60.041, and 60.042, Water Code, by this Act apply to a lease entered
15 into before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

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
