- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 74.053(b), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (b) If a party to a civil $\underline{\text{or criminal}}$ case files a timely
- 7 objection to the assignment, the judge shall not hear the case.
- 8 Except as provided by Subsection (d), each party to the case is only
- 9 entitled to one objection under this section for that case.
- SECTION 2. Section 74.055(c), Government Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (c) To be eligible to be named on the list, a retired or
- 13 former judge must:
- 14 (1) have served as a judge for at least 48 months in a
- district, statutory probate, statutory county, or appellate court;
- 16 (2) have developed substantial experience in the
- 17 judge's area of specialty;
- 18 (3) not have been removed from office;
- 19 (4) certify under oath to the presiding judge, on a
- 20 form prescribed by the state board of regional judges, that the
- 21 judge did not resign from office after having received notice that
- 22 formal proceedings by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct had
- 23 been instituted as provided in Section 33.022 and before the final
- 24 disposition of the proceedings;

- 1 (5) annually demonstrate that the judge has completed
- 2 in the past calendar year the educational requirements for active
- 3 district, statutory probate, and statutory county court judges;
- 4 [and]
- 5 (6) certify to the presiding judge a willingness not
- 6 to appear and plead as an attorney in any court in this state for a
- 7 period of two years; and
- 8 (7) not have been defeated in an election in which the
- 9 judge was a candidate for a district, statutory, or county court.
- SECTION 3. (a) This Act applies only to the eligibility of
- 11 a judge for an assignment made under Chapter 74, Government Code, or
- 12 the right to object to the assignment of a judge assigned under that
- 13 chapter on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 (b) The eligibility for an assignment made under Chapter 74,
- 15 Government Code, before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 16 objection to the assignment of a judge under that chapter are
- governed by the law in effect on the date the assignment was made,
- 18 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
