A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to occupations regulated by the Texas Commission on
- 3 Private Security.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 1702.002(1), (6), (7), and (11),
- 6 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Alarm system" means an alarm system, burglar
- 8 alarm signal device, electronic key pad with a panic alarm feature,
- 9 burglar alarm, robbery alarm, motion [television] camera, [or]
- 10 still camera, or access system for a building with a central
- 11 computer used to signal the presence of an emergency to which law
- 12 enforcement or emergency services other than a fire department may
- 13 $\underline{\text{be}}$ [are] expected to respond.
- 14 (6) "Detection device" means an electronic device used
- 15 as a part of a burglar or robbery alarm, including a control,
- 16 audible alarm, communications device, motion detector, door or
- 17 window switch, sound detector, vibration detector, light beam,
- 18 pressure mat, wiring, or similar device.
- 19 "Extra job coordinator" means a peace officer who:
- 20 (A) is employed full-time by the state or a
- 21 political subdivision of the state [municipality]; and
- 22 (B) schedules other peace officers to provide
- 23 guard, patrolman, or watchman services in a private capacity who
- 24 are:

1	(i) employed full-time by the state or a
2	<pre>political subdivision of the state [municipality]; and</pre>
3	(ii) not employed by the extra job
4	coordinator.
5	(11) "Letter of authority" means a permit issued by
6	the commission that entitles the security department of a private
7	business to employ a commissioned or noncommissioned security
8	officer or a political subdivision to employ a commissioned
9	security officer.

6	chapter or the General Appropriations Act, the commission	n may
7	charge a fee each time the commission requires a person regu	lated
8	under this chapter to resubmit a set of fingerprints for proce	ssing
9	by the commission during the application process for a lic	ense,
10	registration, or commission. The commission shall set the fee	in an
11	amount that is reasonable and necessary to cover the commiss	sion's
12	administrative expenses related to processing the fingerprint	s.

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- (c) A person whose pocket card has not expired is not 13 eligible to receive from the commission another pocket card in the 14 15 same classification in which the pocket card is held.
- SECTION 4. Section 1702.105, Occupations Code, is amended 16 to read as follows: 17
- Sec. 1702.105. ALARM SYSTEMS COMPANY. A person acts as an 18 alarm systems company for the purposes of this chapter if the 19 person: 20
- (1) sells, installs, services, monitors, or responds 21 to an alarm system or detection device; or 22
- (2) consults with a person to sell, install, service, 23 24 monitor, or respond to an alarm system or detection device.
- 25 SECTION 5. Section 1702.114, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 26
- Sec. 1702.114. ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS 27 FOR

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- 1 INVESTIGATIONS COMPANY LICENSE. (a) An applicant for a license to
- 2 engage in the business of an investigations company or the
- 3 applicant's manager must have, before the date of the application,
- 4 three [consecutive] years' experience in the investigative field as
- 5 an employee, manager, or owner of an investigations company or
- 6 satisfy other requirements set by the commission.
- 7 (b) The applicant's experience must <u>have been legally</u>
- 8 obtained and must be:

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- (1) reviewed by the commission or the director; and
- 10 (2) determined to be adequate to qualify the applicant
- 11 to engage in the business of an investigations company.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 1702.115(a), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) An applicant for a license to engage in the business of a
- 15 security services contractor or the applicant's manager must have,
- 16 before the date of the application, two [consecutive] years'
- 17 experience in each security services field for which the person
- 18 applies as an employee, manager, or owner of a security services
- 19 contractor or satisfy other requirements set by the commission.
- SECTION 7. Section 1702.223, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.223. ALARM SYSTEMS INSTALLER. An individual acts
- 23 as an alarm systems installer for purposes of this chapter if the
- 24 individual installs, maintains, or repairs an alarm system or a
- 25 detection device.
- SECTION 8. Section 1702.227, Occupations Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 1702.227. SECURITY SALESPERSON. An individual acts as
- 2 a security salesperson for purposes of this chapter if the
- 3 individual offers to sell, service, or install an alarm system or a
- 4 detection device [is employed by a security services contractor to
- 5 sell services offered by the contractor].
- 6 SECTION 9. Section 1702.309(a), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The commission by rule shall develop a continuing
- 9 education course [in handgun proficiency] required for renewal of a
- 10 security officer commission. Only a commission-approved
- 11 instructor may administer the continuing education course. The
- 12 course must include[+
- 13 $\left[\frac{(1)}{1}\right]$ at least six $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ hours of instruction
- 14 determined by the director of the commission [on one or more of the
- 15 subjects listed in Section 1702.1675(g); and
- 16 [(2) other information that the director determines is
- 17 appropriate].
- SECTION 10. Section 1702.323, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 by amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b), [and] (d), and
- 22 (e), this chapter does not apply to an individual employed in an
- 23 employee-employer relationship exclusively and regularly by one
- employer in connection with the affairs of the employer.
- 25 (d) This chapter applies to an individual described by
- 26 Subsection (a) who[+
- [(1) works at a location that is open to the public;

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 $[\frac{(2)}{2}]$ in the course of employment:

(1) [(A) regularly] comes into contact with the

4 public; [and]

- (2) [(B)] wears a uniform with any type of badge commonly associated with security personnel or law enforcement or a patch or apparel with "security" [or the name of the employer] on the patch or apparel; or
- 9 (3) performs a duty described by Section 1702.222.
- (e) This chapter applies to any person who conducts an investigation if the investigation involves a person, or the affairs of a person, who is not employed by the same employer as the person conducting the investigation and the investigation is not conducted on the premises of the employer. Premises of the employer include walkways, parking areas, and other areas relating to the affairs of the employer.
- 17 SECTION 11. The following laws are repealed:
- 18 (1) Section 1702.166, Occupations Code; and
- 19 (2) Section 1702.281, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 12. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a license, certification, registration, commission, or letter of authority that is originally issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. An issuance or renewal that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
