A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation and taxes of a library district.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 326, Local Government
- 5 Code, is amended by adding Section 326.097 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 326.097. EFFECT OF TAX ON CERTAIN OTHER TAXING UNITS.
- 7 (a) This section applies only to a municipality that does not have
- 8 <u>a municipal public library.</u>
- 9 (b) An election to adopt or increase the local sales and use
- 10 tax under this subchapter is to be treated also as an election that
- 11 will have the effect of reducing the tax rate of an industrial
- 12 <u>development district if:</u>
- 13 (1) all or any part of the proposed district is
- 14 included within the boundaries of an industrial development
- 15 corporation created under Section 4B, Development Corporation Act
- of 1979 (Article 5190.6, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), by the
- 17 municipality after the date of the first filing of a petition with
- 18 the commissioners court of the county to create a library district
- 19 <u>under this chapter; and</u>
- 20 (2) the adoption or increase of the local sales and use
- 21 tax under this subchapter would result in a combined tax rate of
- 22 more than two percent in any location in the proposed district.
- 23 (c) If the voters approve the adoption or increase of the
- 24 district tax under Subsection (b), the tax rate to which the

- 1 development corporation's tax is reduced is the highest rate that
- 2 will not result in a combined tax rate of more than two percent in
- 3 any location in the proposed district.
- 4 (d) The rate of the tax imposed by the development
- 5 corporation is increased without further action of the board or the
- 6 voters of the development corporation or the district on the date on
- 7 which the tax imposed under this subchapter is decreased or
- 8 expires. The development corporation's tax rate increases only to
- 9 the extent that any tax imposed by the development corporation was
- 10 reduced under this section when the tax imposed by the district was
- 11 <u>adopted or increased.</u>
- (e) This section does not permit a taxing unit to impose
- 13 taxes at different tax rates in the territory of the unit.
- 14 (f) For the purposes of holding an election under this
- 15 chapter, a petition filed with the commissioners court of the
- 16 county to create a library district under this chapter is effective
- 17 and valid for subsequent filing purposes until the second
- anniversary of the date on which the petition was first filed.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 326.003(3), Local Government Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (3) "Municipal public library" means a library that
- 22 is:
- 23 (A) financed and operated by a municipality;
- 24 [and]
- 25 (B) accredited for membership in the state
- 26 library system; and
- (C) open free of charge to all members of the

- 1 public under identical conditions.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 326.022(c), Local Government Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (c) If the boundaries of the proposed district include any
- 5 territory that, on the date on which a petition is filed [an
- 6 election is ordered] on the question of creating the district, is
- 7 part of a municipality that <u>operates</u> [operated] a municipal public
- 8 library, then the governing authority of that municipality must
- 9 consent by resolution to allow the inclusion of that municipal
- 10 territory in the proposed district.
- 11 SECTION 4. Section 326.097(f), Local Government Code, as
- 12 added by this Act, applies to a petition that is filed before, on,
- or after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
