## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading of Chapter 607, Government Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 607. BENEFITS RELATING TO CERTAIN CONTAGIOUS DISEASES AND

## 8 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- 9 SECTION 2. Section 607.002, Government Code, is amended to 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 607.002. REIMBURSEMENT. A public safety employee who
- 12 is exposed to a contagious disease or a hazardous material is
- 13 entitled to reimbursement from the employing governmental entity
- 14 for reasonable medical expenses incurred in receiving preventative
- 15 medical treatment because of exposure to [for the prevention of]
- 16 the disease or the hazardous material if:
- 17 (1) the disease is not an "ordinary disease of life" as
- 18 that term is used in the context of a workers' compensation claim or
- 19 the hazardous material is one regulated by state or federal law as a
- 20 <u>hazardous material</u>;

- 21 (2) the exposure to the disease or the hazardous
- 22 material occurs during the course of the employment; and
- 23 (3) the employee requires preventative medical
- 24 treatment because of exposure to the disease or the hazardous

- 1 <u>material</u>.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 607.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 607.003. PHYSICIAN OF CHOICE. A public safety
- 5 employee who is exposed to a disease or a hazardous material
- 6 described by Section 607.002 is entitled to receive preventative
- 7 medical treatment because of exposure to the [be treated for the
- 8 prevention of that] disease or the hazardous material by the
- 9 physician of the employee's choice.
- SECTION 4. Section 607.004, Government Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 607.004. PREVENTATIVE MEDICAL TREATMENT, IMMUNIZATIONS,
- 13 AND VACCINATIONS. (a) A certified fire fighter or other
- 14 governmental employee who operates an ambulance or who responds to
- 15 emergency medical calls is entitled to preventative <u>medical</u>
- treatment or immunization for any disease or any hazardous material
- 17 to which the fire fighter or other governmental employee may be
- 18 exposed in performing official duties and for which preventative
- 19 medical treatment or immunization is possible.
- 20 (b) The employee and any member of the employee's immediate
- 21 family are entitled to vaccination for a contagious disease to
- 22 which the employee is exposed during the course of employment. The
- 23 employee and any member of the employee's immediate family are
- 24 entitled to preventative medical treatment for any hazardous
- 25 material to which the employee is exposed during the course of
- 26 employment.
- 27 (c) The employing governmental entity may satisfy the

- 1 requirements of this section by:
- 2 (1) providing the <u>preventative medical treatment</u>,
- 3 immunization, or vaccination without charge; or
- 4 (2) reimbursing the employee for any necessary and
- 5 reasonable expenses incurred by the employee <u>and any member of the</u>
- 6 employee's immediate family for the preventative medical
- 7 <u>treatment</u>, immunization, or vaccination.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
