(a) The fund may be used to provide low-interest loans to rural political subdivisions for water or water-related projects and for water quality enhancement projects, including the purchase of well fields, the purchase or lease of rights to produce groundwater, onsite or wetland wastewater treatment facilities, and interim financing of construction projects.

The fund may be used to enable a rural political (b) subdivision to obtain water <u>or wastewater service</u> supplied by larger political subdivisions or to finance the consolidation or regionalizing of neighboring political subdivisions, or both. This section does not apply to refunding bonds or bonds issued to and approved by the Farmers Home Administration, the United States Department of Agriculture, the North American Development Bank, or the Texas Water Development Board.

SECTION 9. Sections 49.183(a) and (b), Water Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Except for refunding bonds, or bonds sold to a state or federal agency or to the North American Development Bank, bonds issued by a district shall be sold after advertising for and receiving competitive sealed bids and shall be awarded to the bidder whose bid produces the lowest net effective interest rate to the district.
