- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 54.0065(a), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A qualified student is eligible for a rebate of a
- 9 portion of the undergraduate tuition the student has paid if the
- 10 student:
- 11 (1) is awarded a baccalaureate degree from a general
- 12 academic teaching institution; and
- 13 (2) has attempted no more than three hours in excess of
- 14 the minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete
- 15 the degree, including:
- 16 (A) transfer credits; and
- 17 (B) course credit earned exclusively by
- 18 examination, except that, for purposes of this subsection, only the
- 19 <u>number of semester credit hours earned exclusively by examination</u>
- 20 <u>in excess of nine semester credit hours is treated as hours</u>
- 21 <u>attempted</u>.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 23 54.0065, Education Code, applies only to a student who graduates
- 24 from an institution of higher education on or after the effective

- 1 date of this Act.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
