A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the reading curriculum used in public schools and to
- 3 reading textbooks for public school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 7 (b-1) The essential knowledge and skills of English
- 8 language arts must include reading. The reading curriculum, based
- 9 on scientifically based reading research, must be grade specific
- 10 and increase in depth and complexity from one school year to the
- 11 next, focus on core knowledge, and include essential components of
- 12 reading instruction and instruction to promote reading. In this
- 13 subsection, "essential components of reading instruction,"
- 14 "reading," and "scientifically based reading research" have the
- meanings assigned by Section 1208, No Child Left Behind Act of 2001
- 16 (20 U.S.C. Section 6368), and its subsequent amendments.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 31.023, Education Code, is amended by
- 18 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (a) For each subject and grade level, the State Board of
- 21 Education shall adopt two lists of textbooks. The conforming list
- 22 includes each textbook submitted for the subject and grade level
- that meets applicable physical specifications adopted by the State
- 24 Board of Education, [and] contains material covering each element

- of the essential knowledge and skills of the subject and grade level
- 2 as determined by the State Board of Education under Section 28.002
- 3 presented in an educationally effective manner as proven by
- 4 scientifically based research, and is adopted under Section 31.024.
- 5 The nonconforming list includes each textbook submitted for the
- 6 subject and grade level that:
- 7 (1) meets applicable physical specifications adopted
- 8 by the State Board of Education;
- 9 (2) contains material covering at least half, but not
- 10 all, of the elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the
- 11 subject and grade level presented in an educationally effective
- manner as proven by scientifically based research; and
- 13 (3) is adopted under Section 31.024.
- 14 (a-1) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (a), to
- 15 be placed on the conforming or nonconforming list, a reading
- 16 <u>textbook must include essential components of reading instruction</u>
- 17 and instruction to promote reading, as defined by Section 1208, No
- 18 Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (20 U.S.C. Section 6368), and its
- 19 subsequent amendments, and reflect an increase in depth and
- 20 complexity from one school year to the next.
- 21 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the textbook review and adoption
- 22 requirements under Section 31.022, Education Code, or the textbook
- 23 review and adoption cycle the State Board of Education adopts under
- that section, the board shall review and adopt reading textbooks
- 25 that satisfy requirements under Section 31.023, Education Code, as
- amended by this Act, as soon as practicable.
- 27 SECTION 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this Act apply beginning with

- 1 the 2003-2004 school year.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
