## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to pipeline safety emergency response plans and the repeal

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 117.012, Natural Resources Code, 6
- amended by amending Subsections (h), (i), and (k) and adding 7
- 8 Subsections (1) and (m) to read as follows:
- The commission shall require 9 (h) operators or their
- designated representatives to communicate and conduct liaison 10
- 11 activities with fire, police, and other appropriate public
- 12 emergency response officials. The liaison activities must be
- 13 conducted by meetings in person except as provided by this section.
- 14 An operator or the operator's representative may conduct required
- 15 community liaison activities as provided by Subsection (i) only if
- 16 the operator or the operator's representative has made an effort,
- by one of the following methods, [the following efforts] to conduct 17
- 18 a community liaison meeting in person with the officials:
- mailing a written request for a meeting in person 19
- to the appropriate officials by certified mail, return receipt 20
- 21 requested;
- 22 (2) sending a request for a meeting in person to the
- 23 appropriate officials by facsimile transmission; or [and]
- 24 (3) making one or more telephone calls or

- 1 message transmissions to the appropriate officials to request a

- 3 (i) If the operator or operator's representative cannot
- 4 arrange a meeting in person after complying with Subsection (h),
- 5 the operator or the operator's representative shall make an effort,

- 8 call with the officials:

- 26 (A) a description and map of the pipeline
- 27 facilities that are within 1,000 feet of the school building or

- 1 facility; 2 (B) a list of any product transported in the segment of the pipeline that is within 1,000 feet of the school 3 4 facility; 5 (C) the designated emergency number for the 6 pipeline facility operator; 7 (D) information on the state's excavation 8 one-call system; and (E) information on how to recognize, report, and 9 respond to a product release [develop an emergency response plan in 10 consultation with the fire department in whose jurisdiction the 11 school is located or another local emergency response entity]; and 12 mail a copy of the requested items by certified 13 mail, return receipt requested, to the superintendent of the school 14 15 district in which the school building or facility is located [present the plan: 16 17 [(A) at the first annual budget meeting of the board of trustees of the school district in which the school is 18 located after the plan is developed; and 19 [(B) at subsequent annual budget meetings of the 20 21 board of trustees of the school district on the request of the 22 board]. - 5 SECTION 2. Section 81.056, Natural Resources Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act applies to a permit application that is
- 8 pending with the Railroad Commission of Texas on the effective date
- 9 of this  $\mathsf{Act}$  or that is filed with the commission on or after that
- 10 date.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
