H.B. No. 1952

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to local regulation of public swimming pools.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 341.064, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subsections (n) and (o) to read as follows:

(n) A county or municipality may:

(1) require that the owner or operator of a public swimming pool within the jurisdiction of the county or municipality obtain a permit for operation of the pool; and

(2) inspect a public swimming pool within the jurisdiction of the county or municipality for compliance with this section.

(o) A county or municipality may by order close, for the period specified in the order, a swimming pool within the jurisdiction of the county or municipality if the operation of the pool violates this section or a permitting or inspection requirement imposed by the county or municipality under Subsection (n).

SECTION 2. Section 341.091(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A person commits an offense if the person violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter. A person commits an offense if the person violates a permitting or inspection requirement imposed under Section 341.064(n) or a closure order

1 issued under Section 341.064(o). An offense under this section is a  
2 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$10 or more than  
3 \$200.

4 SECTION 3. Sections 341.092(b), (d), and (h), Health and  
5 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

6 (b) A person who violates this chapter or a rule adopted  
7 under this chapter shall be assessed a civil penalty. A person who  
8 violates a permitting or inspection requirement imposed under  
9 Section 341.064(n) or a closure order issued under Section  
10 341.064(o) shall be assessed a civil penalty. A civil penalty under  
11 this section may not be ~~[of not]~~ less than \$10 or more than \$200 for  
12 each violation and for each day of a continuing violation.

13 (d) If it appears that a person has violated, is violating,  
14 or is threatening to violate this chapter, ~~[or]~~ a rule adopted under  
15 this chapter, a permitting or inspection requirement imposed under  
16 Section 341.064(n), or a closure order issued under Section  
17 341.064(o), the department, a county, a municipality, or the  
18 attorney general on request by the district attorney, criminal  
19 district attorney, county attorney, or, with the approval of the  
20 governing body of the municipality, the attorney for the  
21 municipality may institute a civil suit in a district court for:

22 (1) injunctive relief to restrain the person from  
23 continuing the violation or threat of violation;

24 (2) the assessment and recovery of a civil penalty; or

25 (3) both injunctive relief and a civil penalty.

26 (h) In a suit under this section to enjoin a violation or  
27 threat of violation of this chapter, ~~[or]~~ a rule adopted under this

1 chapter, a permitting or inspection requirement imposed under  
2 Section 341.064(n), or a closure order issued under Section  
3 341.064(o), the court shall grant the state, county, or  
4 municipality, without bond or other undertaking, any injunction  
5 that the facts may warrant, including temporary restraining orders,  
6 temporary injunctions after notice and hearing, and permanent  
7 injunctions.

8 SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Section  
9 341.091, Health and Safety Code, applies only to an offense  
10 committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For purposes  
11 of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date  
12 of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before that date.

13 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this  
14 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,  
15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

16 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
20 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
