## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to changing the titles of the heads of the staff of the
- 3 Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission to executive director and
- 4 assistant executive director.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 5.11, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 5.11. <u>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR</u> [ADMINISTRATOR]. (a) The
- 9 commission shall appoint an <u>executive director</u> [administrator] to
- 10 serve at its will and, subject to its supervision, administer this
- 11 code. Unless the commission orders otherwise, the <u>executive</u>
- 12 <u>director</u> [<u>administrator</u>] shall be manager, secretary, and
- 13 custodian of all records. The <u>executive director</u> [administrator]
- 14 shall devote the executive director's [his] entire time to the
- 15 office and shall receive a salary as appropriated by the
- 16 legislature. The <u>executive director</u> [administrator] shall execute
- a bond in the sum of \$10,000, payable to the state, and conditioned
- 18 as the commission requires.
- 19 (b) A reference in this code or another law to the
- 20 <u>administrator of the commission means the executive director.</u>
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 5.13, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 Sec. 5.13. ASSISTANT <u>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR</u> [ADMINISTRATOR].
- 24 The executive director [administrator] shall appoint an assistant

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executive director [administrator]. The assistant <u>executive</u> 1 director [administrator] must meet the same qualifications as the 2 executive director [administrator]. The assistant executive 3 4 director [administrator] shall take the constitutional oath of office and make a bond in the same amount and on the same conditions 5 6 as the executive director's [administrator's] bond. In the absence of the executive director [administrator], or in case of the 7 8 executive director's [his] inability to act, the assistant executive director [administrator] shall perform the duties 9 conferred on the <u>executive director</u> [administrator] by law or 10 delegated to the <u>executive director</u> [administrator] by the 11 commission. If there is a vacancy in the office of executive 12 director [administrator], the assistant executive director 13 [administrator] shall perform the duties of the executive director 14 15 [administrator] until an executive director [administrator] has been appointed by the commission. At other times the assistant 16 executive director [he] shall perform those duties and have those 17 functions, powers, and authority as may be delegated to the 18 assistant executive director  $[\frac{\text{him}}{\text{l}}]$  by the executive director 19 20 [administrator].

21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
