- 5 SECTION 1. Section 552.137, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 552.137. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN E-MAIL ADDRESSES.
- 8 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, an [An] e-mail
- 9 address of a member of the public that is provided for the purpose
- 10 of communicating electronically with a governmental body is
- 11 confidential and not subject to disclosure under this chapter.
- 12 (b) Confidential information described by this section that
- 13 relates to a member of the public may be disclosed if the member of
- 14 the public affirmatively consents to its release.
- 15 (c) Subsection (a) does not apply to an e-mail address:
- 16 (1) provided to a governmental body by a person who has
- 17 a contractual relationship with the governmental body or by the
- 18 <u>contractor's agent;</u>
- 19 <u>(2) provided to a governmental body by a vendor who</u>
- 20 seeks to contract with the governmental body or by the vendor's
- 21 agent;
- 22 (3) contained in a response to a request for bids or
- 23 proposals, contained in a response to similar invitations
- 24 soliciting offers or information relating to a potential contract,

- 1 or provided to a governmental body in the course of negotiating the
- 2 terms of a contract or potential contract; or
- 3 (4) provided to a governmental body on a letterhead,
- 4 coversheet, printed document, or other document made available to
- 5 <u>the public.</u>
- 6 (d) Subsection (a) does not prevent a governmental body from
- 7 disclosing an e-mail address for any reason to another governmental
- 8 body or to a federal agency.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
