11	confidential and not subject to disclosure under this chapter.
12	(b) Confidential information described by this section that
13	relates to a member of the public may be disclosed if the member of
14	the public affirmatively consents to its release.
15	(c) Subsection (a) does not apply to an e-mail address:
16	(1) provided to a governmental body by a person who has
17	a contractual relationship with the governmental body or by the
18	<pre>contractor's agent;</pre>
19	(2) provided to a governmental body by a vendor who
20	seeks to contract with the governmental body or by the vendor's
21	agent;
22	(3) contained in a response to a request for bids or
23	proposals, contained in a response to similar invitations
24	soliciting offers or information relating to a potential contract,
