## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the transmission of certain unsolicited messages or 3 images to a mobile telephone or pager; providing a criminal penalty. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 35.47, Business & Commerce Code, is 6 7 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows: 8 9 (a-1) A person may not make or cause to be made a transmission of a text or graphic message or of an image for the 10 11 purpose of a solicitation or sale to a mobile telephone or pager 12 number assigned to a resident of this state, unless the person or entity receiving the transmission has given, prior to the 13 14 transmission, consent to make or cause to be made the transmission. This subsection does not apply to: 15 (1) a transmission made by a person offering mobile 16 telephone or pager service, if the person offers the recipient an 17 18 option to not receive further transmissions; (2) a person, or an affiliate of the person, who has an 19 established business relationship with the recipient, if the person 20 21 or affiliate offers the recipient an option to not receive further 22 transmissions; or 23 (3) an action by a commercial mobile service provider that handles or retransmits the message or image, unless the 24

provider assists in transmitting a message or image when the provider knows or is consciously indifferent to the fact that the person or entity sending the message or image is engaged or intends to engage in an act that violates this subsection.

5 (d) On complaint of a called person that Subsection (a), 6 <u>(a-1)</u>, (b), or (c) of this section has been violated, the county or 7 district attorney of the county in which the person resides shall 8 investigate the complaint and file charges if appropriate. A 9 telephone company serving the caller or called person is not 10 responsible for investigating a complaint or keeping records 11 relating to this section.

(e) A person who violates Subsection (a), <u>(a-1)</u>, (b), or (c)
of this section commits an offense. An offense under this section
is a Class C misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a transmission made on or after the effective date of this Act.
