	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to regulating health and safety conditions at youth camps.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 141.007, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Subsections (d), (e), (f), and (g) to read as
6	follows:
7	(d) An employee or agent of the department who enters a
8	youth camp to investigate and inspect conditions shall:
9	(1) notify the person in charge of the camp or the
10	person's designee of any violations as they are discovered; and
11	(2) allow the camp to correct the violations while the
12	investigation and inspection is occurring.

- 13 (e) The department may not extend or delay an investigation
- or inspection to allow the youth camp to correct a violation under
- 15 Subsection (d)(2).
- (f) An employee or agent of the department performing an investigation and inspection under this section may not report a violation that is significant under the department's rules if the
- 19 <u>violation is corrected during the investigation and inspection.</u>
- 20 (g) A penalty may not be imposed on a youth camp for a
- 21 <u>violation that is significant under the department's rules if the</u>
- violation is corrected during an investigation and inspection under
- 23 this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 141.008(a), Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The board may adopt rules to implement this chapter.
- 3 Before adopting a rule under this chapter or readopting a rule under
- 4 <u>Section 2001.039</u>, <u>Government Code</u> [<del>In developing the rules</del>], the
- 5 board shall:
- 6 (1) consult parents, youth camp operators, and
- 7 appropriate public and private officials and organizations;
- 8 (2) make findings, based on empirical data, that the
- 9 rule is needed; and
- 10 (3) forward a copy of the findings and the proposed
- 11 rule to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 141.010, Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 141.010. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The board shall
- 15 appoint a committee to advise the board in the development of
- 16 standards and procedures, make recommendations to the board
- 17 regarding the content of the rules adopted to implement this Act,
- 18 and perform any other functions requested by the board in the
- 19 implementation and administration of the Act.
- 20 (b) The advisory committee may not exceed nine members, at
- least two of whom shall be members of the general public. The other
- 22 members should be experienced camping professionals who represent
- 23 the camping communities of the state. In making the appointments,
- 24 the board shall attempt to reflect the geographic diversity of the
- 25 state in proportion to the number of camps licensed by the
- department in each geographic area of the state.
- 27 [(c) A person is not eligible to be appointed and serve as a

- 1 public member of an advisory committee if the person or the person's
- 2 spouse:
- 3 [(1) is licensed by an occupational regulatory agency
- 4 in the health care field;
- 5 [(2) is employed by a health care facility,
- 6 corporation, or agency or by a corporation authorized to underwrite
- 7 health care insurance;
- 8 [(3) governs or administers a health care facility,
- 9 corporation, or agency;
- 10 [(4) has a financial interest, other than a consumer's
- 11 interest, in a health care facility, corporation, or agency; or
- 12 [(5) is a youth camp operator; is employed by a youth
- 13 camp facility or a youth camp operator; governs or administers a
- 14 youth camp facility, corporation, or agency; or has a financial
- 15 interest, other than a consumer's interest, in a youth camp
- 16 <u>facility, corporation, or agency.</u>]
- 17 (c) Advisory committee members serve for staggered six-year
- terms, with the terms of three members expiring on August 31 of each
- 19 odd-numbered year.
- 20 (d) A vacancy on the advisory committee is filled by the
- 21 board in the same manner as other appointments to the advisory
- 22 committee.
- (e) The advisory committee will meet annually and at the
- 24 call of the commissioner.
- 25 (f) [A member of the advisory committee is entitled to
- 26 reimbursement for expenses incurred in performing duties under this
- 27 Act. The reimbursement may not exceed the amount specified in the

- 1 General Appropriations Act for travel and per diem allowances for
- 2 state employees.
- 3  $\left[\frac{g}{g}\right]$  The advisory committee may elect a chairperson,
- 4 vice-chairperson, and secretary from among its members and may
- 5 adopt rules for the conduct of its own activities.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 141.016(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The penalty may not exceed  $$1,000 \ [\$2,000]$  a day for
- 9 each violation.
- SECTION 5. Subsections (d), (e), (f), and (g), Section
- 11 141.007, Health and Safety Code, as added by Section 1 of this Act,
- 12 apply only to an investigation and inspection of a youth camp that
- occurs on or after the effective date of Section 1 of this Act. An
- 14 investigation and inspection that occurred before the effective
- date of Section 1 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- date the investigation and inspection occurred, and the former law
- is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
