AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the regulation of certain activities associated with 3 providing private security.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subdivisions (1) and (6) and adding Subdivision (6-a)
- 7 to read as follows:

- 8 (1) "Alarm system" means:
- 9 <u>(A) electronic equipment and devices designed to</u>
- 10 <u>detect or signal:</u>
- 11 (i) an unauthorized entry or attempted
- 12 entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area
- monitored by the system; or
- 14 (ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other
- 15 emergency;
- 16 (B) electronic equipment and devices using a
- 17 computer or data processor designed to control the access of a
- 18 person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into
- 19 the controlled area of a residence or business; or
- 20 <u>(C) a television camera or still camera system</u>
- 21 that records, archives, or monitors property or individuals in a
- 22 public or private area of a residence or business [an alarm system,
- 23 burglar alarm signal device, burglar alarm, robbery alarm,
- 24 television camera, or still camera used to signal the presence of an

- 1 emergency to which law enforcement or emergency services are
- 2 expected to respond].
- 3 (6) "Detection device" means an electronic device used
- 4 as a part of <u>an alarm system</u> [a burglar or robbery alarm], including
- 5 a control, communications device, motion detector, door or window
- 6 switch, sound detector, vibration detector, light beam, pressure
- 7 mat, wiring, or similar device.
- 8 (6-a) "Electronic access control device" means an
- 9 electronic, electrical, or computer-based device that allows
- 10 access to a controlled area of a business, but that is not monitored
- and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or emergency
- 12 services respond. The term does not include a mechanical device,
- 13 such as a deadbolt or lock.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 1702.0635 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1702.0635. RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN RULES. The
- 17 commission may not adopt rules or establish unduly restrictive
- 18 experience or education requirements that limit a person's ability
- 19 to be licensed as an electronic access control device company or be
- 20 registered as an electronic access control device installer.
- 21 SECTION 3. Subchapter F, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 1702.1025 to read as follows:
- 23 Sec. 1702.1025. ELECTRONIC ACCESS CONTROL DEVICE COMPANY
- 24 LICENSE REQUIRED; SCOPE OF LICENSE. (a) Unless the person holds a
- 25 license as an electronic access control device company, a person
- 26 may not:
- 27 (1) act as an electronic access control device

- 1 company;
- 2 (2) offer to perform the services of an electronic
- 3 access control device company; or
- 4 (3) engage in business activity for which a license is
- 5 required under this chapter.
- 6 (b) A person licensed as an electronic access control device
- 7 company may not install alarm systems unless otherwise licensed or
- 8 registered to install alarm systems under this chapter.
- 9 SECTION 4. Sections 1702.103(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
- 10 are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The license classifications are:
- 12 (1) Class A: investigations company license, covering
- operations of an investigations company;
- 14 (2) Class B: security services contractor license,
- 15 covering operations of a security services contractor; [and]
- 16 (3) Class C: covering the operations included within
- 17 Class A and Class B; and
- 18 (4) Class D: electronic access control device license,
- 19 covering operations of an electronic access control device company.
- 20 (b) A Class A, B, [or D license does not authorize the
- 21 license holder to perform a service for which the license holder has
- 22 not qualified. A person may not engage in an operation outside the
- 23 scope of that person's license. The commission shall indicate on
- 24 the license the services the license holder is authorized to
- 25 perform. The license holder may not perform a service unless it is
- 26 indicated on the license.
- SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is

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- 1 amended by adding Sections 1702.1055 and 1702.1056 to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 Sec. 1702.1055. ELECTRONIC ACCESS CONTROL DEVICE COMPANY. A
- 4 person acts as an electronic access control device company for the
- 5 purposes of this chapter if the person installs or maintains an
- 6 electronic access control device.
- 7 Sec. 1702.1056. LOCKSMITH COMPANY. A person acts as a
- 8 locksmith company for the purposes of this chapter if the person:
- 9 (1) installs and maintains mechanical security
- 10 devices, including deadbolts and locks; and
- 11 (2) cuts keys for mechanical security devices.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 1702.124(a), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The commission may not issue a license unless the
- 15 applicant files with the commission:
- 16 (1) evidence of a general liability insurance policy
- 17 on a certificate of insurance form prescribed by the Texas
- 18 Department of Insurance [commission] and countersigned by an
- insurance agent licensed in this state; or
- 20 (2) a certificate of insurance for surplus lines
- 21 coverage obtained under Chapter 981 [Article 1.14-2], Insurance
- 22 Code, through a licensed Texas surplus lines agent resident in this
- 23 state.
- SECTION 7. Section 1702.221, Occupations Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.221. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. An individual must
- 27 register with the commission as provided by commission rule if the

- 1 individual:
- 2 (1) is employed as an alarm systems installer, alarm
- 3 systems monitor, electronic access control device installer,
- 4 locksmith, dog trainer, manager or branch office manager,
- 5 noncommissioned security officer, private investigator, private
- 6 security consultant, or security salesperson; or
- 7 (2) is an owner, officer, partner, or shareholder of a
- 8 license holder.
- 9 SECTION 8. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 1702.2225 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 1702.2225. LOCKSMITH COMPANY REGISTRATION REQUIRED.
- 12 Unless the person is registered as a locksmith company, a person may
- 13 <u>not:</u>
- (1) act as a locksmith company;
- 15 (2) offer to perform the services of a locksmith
- 16 company; or
- 17 (3) engage in business activity for which registration
- is required under this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 9. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Sections 1702.2226 and 1702.2227 to read as
- 21 follows:
- Sec. 1702.2226. ELECTRONIC ACCESS CONTROL DEVICE
- 23 <u>INSTALLER</u>. (a) An individual acts as an electronic access control
- 24 device installer for purposes of this chapter if the individual
- 25 <u>installs</u>, maintains, or repairs an electronic access control
- 26 device.
- 27 (b) A person registered as an electronic access control

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- 1 device installer may not install alarm systems unless the person is
- 2 registered under this chapter as an alarm systems installer.
- 3 Sec. 1702.2227. LOCKSMITH. An individual acts as a
- 4 locksmith for the purposes of this chapter if the person installs
- 5 and maintains mechanical security devices, including deadbolts and
- 6 locks, and cuts keys for mechanical security devices.
- 7 SECTION 10. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 1702.236 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1702.236. EXAMINATION AND TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 10 <u>ELECTRONIC ACCESS CONTROL DEVICE INSTALLERS</u>. (a) The commission
- 11 shall require an individual who applies for registration as an
- 12 electronic access control device installer to pass an examination
- 13 given by the commission or a person approved by the commission. The
- 14 examination must cover material related to access control.
- (b) Before September 1, 2005, the commission shall allow an
- 16 electronic access control device installer to obtain or renew a
- 17 certificate of registration by fulfilling the requirements of a
- 18 commission-approved, industry-based educational training program.
- 19 This subsection expires September 1, 2006.
- 20 (c) On and after September 1, 2005, the commission by rule
- 21 may allow an electronic access control device installer to obtain
- 22 or renew a certificate of registration by fulfilling the
- 23 requirements of a commission-approved, industry-based educational
- 24 training program.
- 25 (d) A party who asserts that the commission has adopted a
- 26 rule in violation of Subsection (b) or (c) may appeal to the
- 27 attorney general for a determination of whether the rule violates

- 1 the subsection because the rule does not comply with reasonable
- 2 business practices. The attorney general shall make a
- 3 <u>determination on an appeal submitted under this section not later</u>
- 4 than the 90th day after the date the appeal is submitted or within a
- 5 reasonable time as circumstances require. The challenged rule may
- 6 not take effect until after the attorney general makes a
- 7 determination. This subsection expires September 1, 2007.
- 8 SECTION 11. Section 1702.223, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 1702.223. ALARM SYSTEMS INSTALLER. (a) An individual
- 11 acts as an alarm systems installer for purposes of this chapter if
- 12 the individual installs, maintains, or repairs an alarm system or
- 13 detection device.
- 14 <u>(b) An alarm systems installer may install, maintain, or</u>
- 15 repair an electronic access control device.
- SECTION 12. Section 1702.239(a), Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The commission may require that an individual employed
- 19 as an alarm systems installer or security salesperson hold a
- 20 certification by a commission-approved training program to renew an
- 21 initial registration. The commission may approve only nationally
- 22 recognized training programs that consist of at least 16 [20] hours
- of classroom study in the areas of work allowed by the registration.
- 24 To be approved, a training program must offer at least two
- 25 certification programs each year, sufficient to complete the
- 26 requirements of this subsection, within 100 miles of each county in
- the state that has a population of more than 500,000.

- SECTION 13. Section 1702.324(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

 (b) This chapter does not apply to:

 (1) a manufacturer or a manufacturer's authorized
- 4 (1) a manufacturer or a manufacturer's authorized 5 distributor who sells equipment to a license holder or registrant 6 that is used in the operations for which the person is required to 7 be licensed or registered;
- 8 (2) a person engaged exclusively in the business of obtaining and providing information to:
- 10 (A) determine creditworthiness;
- 11 (B) collect debts; or
- (C) ascertain the reliability of information provided by an applicant for property, life, or disability insurance or an indemnity or surety bond;
- 15 (3) a person engaged exclusively in the business of 16 repossessing property that is secured by a mortgage or other 17 security interest;
- 18 (4) [a locksmith who:
- 19 [(A) does not install or service detection
- 20 devices;
- 21 [(B) does not conduct investigations; and
- 22 [(C) is not a security services contractor;
- [(5)] a person who:
- 24 (A) is engaged in the business of psychological
- 25 testing or other testing and interviewing services, including
- 26 services to determine attitudes, honesty, intelligence,
- 27 personality, and skills, for preemployment purposes; and

- 1 (B) does not perform any other service that
- 2 requires a license under this chapter;
- 3 (5) (6) a person who:
- 4 (A) is engaged in obtaining information that is a
- 5 public record under Chapter 552, Government Code, regardless of
- 6 whether the person receives compensation;
- 7 (B) is not a full-time employee, as defined by
- 8 Section 61.001, Labor Code, of a person licensed under this
- 9 chapter; and
- 10 (C) does not perform any other act that requires
- 11 a license under this chapter;
- (6) $\left[\frac{(7)}{}\right]$ a licensed professional engineer practicing
- 13 engineering or directly supervising engineering practice under
- 14 Chapter 1001, Occupations Code [The Texas Engineering Practice Act
- 15 (Article 3271a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes)], including
- 16 forensic analysis, burglar alarm system engineering, and necessary
- 17 data collection;
- 18 (7) [$\frac{(8)}{}$] an employee of a cattle association who
- 19 inspects livestock brands under the authority granted to the cattle
- 20 association by the Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards
- 21 Administration of the United States Department of Agriculture;
- (8) (8) (9) a landman performing activities in the
- 23 course and scope of the landman's business;
- (9) $\left[\frac{(10)}{(10)}\right]$ an attorney while engaged in the practice
- 25 of law;
- (10) $[\frac{(11)}{(11)}]$ a person who obtains a document for use in
- 27 litigation under an authorization or subpoena issued for a written

- 1 or oral deposition; or
- 2 (11) $[\frac{(12)}{1}]$ an admitted insurer, insurance adjuster,
- 3 agent, or insurance broker licensed by the state, performing duties
- 4 in connection with insurance transacted by that person.
- 5 SECTION 14. Section 1702.328, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1702.328. SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES AND INSTALLATION.
- 8 This chapter does not apply to:
- 9 (1) a person who owns and installs a burglar detection
- 10 or alarm device on the person's own property or, if the person does
- 11 not charge for the device or the installation, installs the device
- 12 for the protection of the person's personal property located on
- 13 another person's property and does not, as a normal business
- 14 practice, install the devices on the property of another;
- 15 (2) a person in the business of building construction
- 16 that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in
- 17 part the installation of a burglar alarm or detection device if:
- 18 (A) the person is a party to a contract that
- 19 provides that:
- 20 (i) the installation will be performed
- 21 under the direct supervision of, and inspected and certified by, a
- 22 person licensed to install and certify the alarm or detection
- 23 device; and
- 24 (ii) the license holder assumes full
- 25 responsibility for the installation of the alarm or detection
- 26 device; and
- 27 (B) the person does not service or maintain alarm

- 1 systems, electronic access control devices, locks, [burglar
- 2 alarms] or detection devices;
- 3 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar
- 4 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a
- 5 license under this chapter; or
- 6 (4) a person who sells exclusively over the counter or
- 7 by mail order [burglar] alarm systems, electronic access control
- 8 <u>devices</u>, locks, or detection [signal] devices[, burglary alarms,
- 9 television cameras, still cameras, or other electrical,
- 10 mechanical, or electronic devices used for preventing or detecting
- 11 burglary, theft, or other losses].
- 12 SECTION 15. (a) Not later than January 1, 2004, the Texas
- 13 Commission on Private Security shall adopt the rules necessary to
- 14 administer the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 1702,
- 15 Occupations Code.
- 16 (b) Notwithstanding Sections 1702.1025 and 1702.2225,
- 17 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, and Section 1702.221,
- Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, a person is not required
- 19 to hold a license as an electronic access control device company or
- 20 be registered as an electronic access control device installer, a
- locksmith company, or a locksmith before September 1, 2004.
- SECTION 16. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 24 (b) Sections 1702.1025 and 1702.2225, Occupations Code, as
- added by this Act, take effect January 1, 2004.
