4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections 1702.002(1) and (6), Occupations Code,
6	are amended to read as follows:
7	(1) "Alarm system" means:
8	(A) electronic equipment and devices designed to
9	<pre>detect or signal:</pre>
10	(i) an unauthorized entry or attempted
11	entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area
12	monitored by the system; or
13	(ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other
14	<pre>emergency;</pre>
15	(B) electronic equipment and devices using a
16	computer or data processor designed to control the access of a
17	person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into
18	the controlled area of a residence or business; or
19	(C) a television camera or still camera system
20	that records, archives, or monitors property or individuals in a
21	public or private area of a residence or business [an alarm system,
22	burglar alarm signal device, burglar alarm, robbery alarm,
23	television camera, or still camera used to signal the presence of an
24	emergency to which law enforcement or emergency services are

- 2 (6) "Detection device" means an electronic device used
- 3 as a part of <u>an alarm system</u> [a burglar or robbery alarm], including
- 4 a control, communications device, motion detector, door or window
- 5 switch, sound detector, vibration detector, light beam, pressure
- 6 mat, wiring, or similar device.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 1702.124(a), Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The commission may not issue a license unless the
- 10 applicant files with the commission:
- 11 (1) evidence of a general liability insurance policy
- 12 on a certificate of insurance form prescribed by the Texas
- 13 Department of Insurance [commission] and countersigned by an
- insurance agent licensed in this state; or
- 15 (2) a certificate of insurance for surplus lines
- 16 coverage obtained under Chapter 981 [Article 1.14-2], Insurance
- 17 Code, through a licensed Texas surplus lines agent resident in this
- 18 state.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 1702.223, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.223. ALARM SYSTEMS INSTALLER. An individual acts
- 22 as an alarm systems installer for purposes of this chapter if the
- 23 individual installs, maintains, or repairs an alarm system or
- 24 <u>detection device</u>.
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 1702.239(a), Occupations Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) The commission may require that an individual employed

- 1 as an alarm systems installer or security salesperson hold a
- 2 certification by a commission-approved training program to renew an
- 3 initial registration. The commission may approve only nationally
- 4 recognized training programs that consist of at least 16 [20] hours
- of classroom study in the areas of work allowed by the registration.
- 6 To be approved, a training program must offer at least two
- 7 certification programs each year, sufficient to complete the
- 8 requirements of this subsection, within 100 miles of each county in
- 9 the state that has a population of more than 500,000.
- SECTION 5. Section 1702.324(b), Occupations Code, is

- or alarm device on the person's own property or, if the person does

- 7 (B) the person does not service or maintain <u>alarm</u>
- 8 systems [burglar alarms] or detection devices;
- 9 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar
- 10 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a
- 11 license under this chapter; or
- 12 (4) a person who sells exclusively over the counter or
- 13 by mail order [burglar] alarm systems or detection [signal]
- 14 devices[, burglary alarms, television cameras, still cameras, or
- 15 other electrical, mechanical, or electronic devices used for
- 16 preventing or detecting burglary, theft, or other losses].
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
