3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter T to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER T. GRADUATED DRIVER LICENSING
7	Sec. 521.481. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Conviction free" means that a person has not been
9	convicted or adjudicated under juvenile proceedings for an offense
10	under state or local law relating to the operation of a motor
11	vehicle, including an offense under Section 106.041, Alcoholic
12	Beverage Code, or an offense under Chapter 49, Penal Code,
13	involving operation of a motor vehicle, but excluding an offense
14	specifically applying only to the type of license or permit held by
15	the person.
16	(2) "Successfully complied" means that:
17	(A) the person did not violate any provision of
18	law specifically applying only to the type of license or permit held
19	by the person; or
20	(B) if the person violated such a provision, the
21	person has been subject to the consequences prescribed by law for
22	the violation.
23	Sec. 521.482. APPLICATION. This subchapter applies only to
24	a person under 18 years of age.

- Sec. 521.483. STAGE 1: INSTRUCTION PERMIT. (a) 1 2 addition to the restrictions imposed by Section 521.222(d) and other law, a holder of an instruction permit may not operate a motor 3 4 vehicle unless the person and each passenger in the motor vehicle is 5 secured by a safety belt or child passenger safety seat system. (b) The department shall indicate "INSTRUCTION PERMIT" on 6 7 the face of each instruction permit. 8 Sec. 521.484. STAGE 2: INTERMEDIATE LICENSE. (a) 9 department may issue an intermediate license to a person who: (1) meets the requirements of Section 521.204 for 10 issuance of a Class C driver's license; and 11 12 (2) during the three-month period preceding the date of application for the intermediate license, has: 13
- 14 (A) held an instruction permit;
- 15 (B) been conviction free; and
- 16 (C) successfully complied with the conditions of holding an instruction permit.
- 18 <u>(b) In addition to the restrictions imposed by Section</u>
 19 <u>545.424 and other law, the holder of an intermediate license may not</u>
 20 <u>operate a motor vehicle unless the person and each passenger in the</u>
 21 <u>motor vehicle is secured by a safety belt or child passenger safety</u>
- 22 <u>seat system.</u>
- 23 (c) The department shall indicate "INTERMEDIATE LICENSE" on the face of each intermediate license.
- Sec. 521.485. STAGE 3: CLASS A, B, OR C LICENSE. The
- 26 department may not issue a Class A, B, or C driver's license to a
- 27 person unless:

- 1 (1) the person has held an intermediate license for at
- 2 least six months;
- 3 (2) the combined period during which the person held
- 4 an instruction permit and intermediate license is at least one
- 5 year; and
- 6 (3) during the one-year period preceding the date of
- 7 application for the Class A, B, or C license, the person has:
- 8 (A) been conviction free; and
- 9 (B) successfully complied with the conditions of
- 10 holding the applicable license.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 521.001(a)(3), Transportation Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (3) "Driver's license" means an authorization issued
- 14 by the department for the operation of a motor vehicle. The term
- 15 includes:
- 16 (A) a temporary license, [or] instruction
- 17 permit, or intermediate license; and
- 18 (B) an occupational license.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 521.204, Transportation Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 521.204. RESTRICTIONS ON MINOR. $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ The department
- 22 may issue a Class C driver's license to an applicant under 18 years
- 23 of age only if the applicant:
- 24 (1) is 16 years of age or older;
- 25 (2) has submitted to the department a driver education
- 26 certificate issued under Section 9A, Texas Driver and Traffic
- 27 Safety Education Act (Article 4413(29c), Vernon's Texas Civil

- 1 Statutes), that states that the person has completed and passed a
- 2 driver education course approved by the department under Section
- 3 521.205 or by the Texas Education Agency;
- 4 (3) has obtained a high school diploma or its
- 5 equivalent or is a student:
- 6 (A) enrolled in a public school, home school, or
- 7 private school who attended school for at least 80 days in the fall
- 8 or spring semester preceding the date of the driver's license
- 9 application; or
- 10 (B) who has been enrolled for at least 45 days,
- and is enrolled as of the date of the application, in a program to
- 12 prepare persons to pass the high school equivalency exam; and
- 13 (4) has passed the examination required by Section
- 14 521.161.
- 15 [(b) The department may not issue a Class A, B, or C driver's
- 16 license other than a hardship license to an applicant under 18 years
- 17 of age unless the applicant has held an instruction permit or
- 18 hardship license for at least six months preceding the date of the
- 19 application.
- SECTION 4. Section 545.424(a), Transportation Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A holder of an intermediate license [person under 18
- 23 years of age, during the six-month period following issuance of an
- 24 original Class A, B, or C driver's license to the person, may not
- 25 operate a motor vehicle:
- 26 (1) after midnight and before 5 a.m. unless the
- operation of the vehicle is necessary for the operator to attend or

- 1 participate in employment or a school-related activity or because
- 2 of a medical emergency; or
- 3 (2) with more than one passenger in the vehicle under
- 4 21 years of age who is not a family member.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect the validity or effect
- 6 of a driver's license, including an instruction permit, issued
- 7 before the effective date of this Act. A license issued before the
- 8 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the
- 9 license was issued, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
