- 9 (1) a public work that involves [structural,]
- 10 electrical  $[\tau]$  or mechanical engineering, if the contemplated
- 11 expense for the completed project is \$8,000 or less;
- 12 (2) a public work that does not involve [structural,]
- 13 electrical  $[\tau]$  or mechanical engineering, if the contemplated
- expense for the completed project is \$20,000 or less; or
- 15 (3) road maintenance or improvement undertaken by the
- 16 commissioners court of a county.
- 17 SECTION 2. In the event of a conflict between a provision of
- 18 this Act and another Act passed by the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 19 Session, 2003, that becomes law, this Act prevails and controls
- 20 regardless of the relative dates of enactment.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2003, if it
- 22 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 23 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 24 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that
