7 (a) The [Each month the] local registrar of deaths shall

prepare an abstract of each death certificate issued [in the month]

for a decedent 18 years of age or older who was a resident of the

state at the time of death. The local registrar of deaths shall

file each abstract with the voter registrar of the decedent's

12 county of residence not later than the 10th day after the date the

death certificate is issued [of the month following the month in

14 which the abstract is prepared].

adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

17 (d) For each abstract of a death certificate required to be

filed under Subsection (a) that is filed after the date established

20 shall pay on behalf of the local registrar of deaths to the

21 secretary of state a late fee of \$25. The secretary of state may

22 require reports from, or audit the records of, a local registrar of

deaths as necessary to enforce this subsection.

- 2 (a) The justice of the peace is the local registrar of 3 births and deaths in a justice of the peace precinct. However, the 4 duty of registering births and deaths may be transferred to the county clerk if the justice of the peace and the county clerk agree 5 6 in writing and the agreement is ratified by the commissioners 7 The county shall notify the secretary of state, in the manner required by the secretary of state, of the person serving as 8 the local registrar for births and deaths in the county. 9
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, except that Section 2 of this Act takes effect September 1, 2004.
