5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 301.1615 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 301.1615. OBTAINING CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD
9	INFORMATION; HEARING. (a) In addition to the information to which
10	the board is entitled under Section 411.125, Government Code, the
11	board may request and receive criminal history record information
12	from the Federal Bureau of Investigation as provided by Section
13	411.087, Government Code.
14	(b) Criminal history record information received by the
15	board may be used only by the board and is privileged. The
16	information may not be disclosed to any person other than:
17	(1) as required under a court order; or
18	(2) to a nursing board that is a member of the nurse
19	licensure compact under Chapter 304.
20	(c) If, on the basis of criminal history record information

- 26 REQUIREMENT FOR RENEWAL. (a) The board may require that an

- 2 renewal, a complete and legible set of fingerprints, on a form

- 6 (b) The board may refuse to renew the license of a person who
- 7 <u>does not comply with the requirement of Subsection (a). Renewal of</u>

- SECTION 4. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 11 (b) The change in law made by this Act applies only to an
- 12 application for the issuance or renewal of a license that is filed
- 13 with the Board of Nurse Examiners on or after the effective date of
- 14 this Act. An application for the issuance or renewal of a license
- that is filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 16 the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the
- 17 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
