5	SECTION 1. Section 15.008, Water Code, is amended to read as
6	follows:
7	Sec. 15.008. GRANT STANDARDS. The law regarding uniform
8	grants and contract management, Chapter 783, Government Code, does
9	not apply to a contract under Subchapter F, H, K, or P, or to a
10	contract relating to an economically distressed area [or nonborder
11	colonia] under Subchapter C.
12	SECTION 2. Section 15.102(b), Water Code, as amended by
13	Chapters 966, 1234, and 1367, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular
14	Session, 2001, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
15	(b) The loan fund may also be used by the board to provide:
16	(1) grants or loans for $[\cdot; (1)]$ projects that include
17	supplying water and wastewater services in economically distressed

- and the benefit of the project to the area in relation to the needs
- 12 of other areas requiring state assistance in any manner and the

- 14 (2) the availability of revenue to the applicant from
- 15 all sources for the ultimate repayment of the cost of the project,
- 16 including all interest;
- 17 (3) the relationship of the project to overall
- 18 statewide needs;
- 19 (4) the ability of the applicant to finance the
- 20 project without state assistance;
- 21 (5) for applications for grants or loans for
- 22 economically distressed areas [or nonborder colonias], the
- 23 regulatory efforts by the county in which the project is located to

- 3 SECTION 4. Section 775.002(c), Government Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (c) The colonia initiatives coordinator may work with the
- 6 other agencies and local officials involved in colonia projects in
- 7 the state to:
- 8 (1) coordinate efforts to address colonia issues;
- 9 (2) identify nonprofit self-help groups to help with
- 10 colonia initiatives;
- 11 (3) set goals for each state fiscal year for colonia

- 14 (B) ensure that water and wastewater connections

- SECTION 5. Section 2306.581(1), Government Code, is amended

- 2 the federal Office of Management and Budget poverty index, and
- 3 meets the qualifications of an economically distressed area under
- 4 Section 17.921, Water Code; or
- 5 (B) has the physical and economic
- 6 characteristics of a colonia, as determined by the department.
- 7 SECTION 6. Section 15.001(12), Water Code, as added by
- 8 Chapter 1367, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001,
- 9 is repealed.
- SECTION 7. Section 775.001(3), Government Code, is
- 11 repealed.
- SECTION 8. The changes in law made by Sections 1, 2, 3, 5,
- 13 and 6 of this Act apply only to an application for assistance that
- is filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
