## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to a pilot program to encourage certification to teach
3	bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter N to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N. PILOT PROGRAM TO ENCOURAGE CERTIFICATION
8	TO TEACH BILINGUAL EDUCATION, ENGLISH AS A SECOND
9	LANGUAGE, OR SPANISH_
10	Sec. 21.651. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Board" means the State Board for Educator
12	Certification.
13	(2) "Program" means the Pilot Program to Encourage
14	Certification to Teach Bilingual Education, English as a Second
15	Language, or Spanish.
16	Sec. 21.652. PURPOSE. The purpose of the program is to
17	encourage students currently enrolled in junior colleges and senior
18	colleges and universities, educational aides, and others to become
19	certified to teach bilingual education, English as a second
20	language, or Spanish in order to enable them to teach those classes
21	or courses in public schools.
22	Sec. 21.653. ESTABLISHING PROGRAM. (a) The board by rule
23	shall establish the program at the University of North Texas at
24	Dallas consistent with the purpose provided by Section 21.652 for

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- 1 students who enroll in, including students who transfer to, an
- 2 educator preparation program at the university to become certified
- 3 to teach bilingual education, English as a second language, or
- 4 Spanish.
- 5 (b) In proposing rules for the program, the board shall
- 6 ensure that the rules require providing notice concerning the
- 7 program to:
- 8 (1) students, regardless of major, at the University
- 9 of North Texas at Dallas, at other senior colleges and universities
- 10 <u>in the north Texas region</u>, and at public junior colleges in the
- 11 north Texas region;
- 12 (2) students at high schools in the north Texas
- 13 region; and
- 14 (3) educational aides at public schools in the north
- 15 Texas region.
- Sec. 21.654. FINANCIAL INCENTIVES. (a) The program must
- 17 offer to participants financial incentives, including tuition
- assistance and loan forgiveness. The program also may offer annual
- 19 stipends to postbaccalaureate candidates for teacher certification
- in bilingual education, English as a second language, or Spanish.
- 21 <u>In offering a financial incentive, the board shall:</u>
- (1) require a contract between each participant who
- 23 accepts a financial incentive and the board under which the
- 24 participant is obligated to:
- 25 (A) obtain certification to teach bilingual
- 26 education, English as a second language, or Spanish; and
- 27 (B) teach a class or course in bilingual

- 1 education, English as a second language, or Spanish in a public
- 2 school in this state for a stated period after certification; and
- 3 (2) provide financial incentives in proportion to the
- 4 length of the period the participant is obligated by contract to
- 5 teach after certification.
- 6 (b) Financial incentives may be paid only from funds
- 7 appropriated specifically for that purpose and from gifts, grants,
- 8 and donations solicited or accepted by the board for that purpose.
- 9 (c) The board shall propose rules establishing criteria for
- 10 awarding financial incentives under this section, including
- 11 criteria for awarding financial incentives if there are more
- 12 participants than funds available to provide the financial
- 13 incentives.
- 14 SECTION 2. The State Board for Educator Certification shall
- propose rules as required under Subchapter N, Chapter 21, Education
- 16 Code, as added by this Act, not later than April 1, 2004.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
