- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 161, Agriculture Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 161.0411 to read as follows:
- Sec. 161.0411. DOMESTIC AND EXOTIC FOWL REGISTRATION. (a) 7 A seller, distributor, or transporter of live domestic or exotic 8
- fowl in this state shall register with the commission under this 9 section. The commission may exempt from registration a person 10
- 11 participating in a disease surveillance program recognized by the
- 12 commission.
- 13 (b) A person may apply for a certificate of registration or
- 14 a renewal of a certificate of registration under this section by
- submitting an application and an annual fee prescribed by the 15
- 16 commission. A person must complete an application for a
- certificate of registration that includes a list of each location 17
- 18 at which the person conducts the sale, distribution, or
- transportation of domestic or exotic fowl. 19
- (c) The commission shall adopt rules to administer this 20
- 21 section, including rules relating to the testing, identification,
- transportation, inspection, sanitation, and disinfection of 22
- 23 domestic and exotic fowl.
- (d) The commission shall prescribe and collect an annual fee 24

- 1 for registration as a seller, distributor, or transporter of
- 2 domestic or exotic fowl in this state.
- 3 (e) The commission may set fees under this section in
- 4 amounts that do not exceed the amounts necessary to enable the
- 5 commission to recover the costs of administering this section.
- 6 (f) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 7 <u>violates this section or fails to comply with an order or rule</u>
- 8 adopted under this section.
- 9 (g) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor
- 10 unless it is shown on the trial of the offense that the defendant
- 11 has been previously convicted under this section, in which event
- 12 the offense is a Class B misdemeanor.
- SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2004, the Texas Animal
- 14 Health Commission shall adopt rules to administer Section 161.0411,
- 15 Agriculture Code, as added by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
