A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the annexation by certain junior college districts of
- 3 remaining territory in a political subdivision.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 130.071, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 130.071. ANNEXATION OF <u>POLITICAL SUBDIVISION</u> [CITY]
- 8 TERRITORY BY CERTAIN DISTRICTS. (a) A junior college district that
- 9 is located within part of a school district, city, town, or village
- 10 may annex [the] territory included within the school district,
- 11 city, town, or village in accordance with this section.
- 12 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (k) of this section,
- 13 the governing board of the junior college district shall order an
- 14 election to be conducted within the boundaries of the district as
- 15 changed by the proposed annexation. The order for the election
- 16 shall:
- 17 (1) describe the territory to be annexed; and
- 18 (2) set a date for the election, which shall be the
- 19 next uniform election date that is more than 45 days from the date
- 20 of the order.
- 21 (c) The president of the board of trustees shall give notice
- 22 of the election in the manner provided by law for notice by the
- 23 county judge of general elections.
- 24 (d) The governing board of the junior college district shall

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- 1 procure the election supplies necessary to conduct the election and
- 2 shall determine the quantity of the various types of supplies to be
- 3 provided for use at each precinct polling place and early voting
- 4 polling place.
- 5 (e) Any qualified voter residing within the boundaries of
- 6 the district as changed by the proposed annexation is entitled to
- 7 vote at the election.
- 8 (f) The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or
- 9 against the proposition: "Annexation of the following territory for
- 10 junior college purposes: ______", with the blank filled in
- 11 with a description of the territory proposed for annexation.
- 12 (g) To be adopted, the measure must receive a favorable vote
- of a majority of those voting on the measure.
- (h) If the measure is adopted, the governing board of the
- 15 district shall enter an order declaring the result of the election
- 16 and that the territory is annexed for junior college purposes. If
- 17 the governing board members are elected from single-member
- districts, the order shall also assign the annexed territory to one
- 19 or more single-member districts that are contiguous with the
- 20 annexed territory.
- 21 (i) If the measure is not adopted, another election to annex
- the same territory may not be held earlier than one year after the
- 23 date of the election in which the measure is defeated.
- 24 (j) An annexation does not affect the term of office for
- 25 governing board members serving on election day.
- 26 (k) If the junior college district annexes under this
- 27 section territory comprising all of a school district, city, town,

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- 1 or village, the governing board by order may annex for junior
- 2 college purposes any territory later annexed by the <u>school</u>
- 3 <u>district</u>, city, town, or village.
- 4 (1) A junior college district may not annex under this
- 5 section territory that is included within the boundaries of another
- 6 junior college district.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
