A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the subpoena authority of the Texas State Board of 3 Examiners of Psychologists.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 501, Occupations Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 501.207 to read as follows:
- Sec. 501.207. SUBPOENAS. (a) In an investigation of a complaint filed with the board, the executive director or presiding officer of the board may issue a subpoena to compel the attendance of a relevant witness or the production, for inspection or copying, of relevant evidence that is in this state.
- 12 <u>(b) A subpoena may be served personally or by certified</u>
 13 mail.
- 14 <u>(c) If a person fails to comply with a subpoena, the board,</u>
 15 <u>acting through the attorney general, may file suit to enforce the</u>
 16 <u>subpoena in a district court in Travis County or in the county in</u>
 17 which a hearing conducted by the board may be held.
- 18 <u>(d) On finding that good cause exists for issuing the</u>
 19 <u>subpoena, the court shall order the person to comply with the</u>
 20 <u>subpoena. The court may punish a person who fails to obey the court</u>
 21 order.
- (e) The board shall pay for photocopies subpoenaed under this section a reasonable fee in an amount not to exceed the amount the board may charge for copies of its records.

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- 1 (f) The reimbursement of the expenses of a witness whose
- 2 attendance is compelled under this section is governed by Section
- 3 <u>2001.103</u>, Government Code.
- 4 (g) Information and materials subpoenaed or compiled by the
- 5 board in connection with the investigation of a complaint may be
- 6 disclosed only as provided by Section 501.205.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 501.207, Occupations Code, as added by
- 8 this Act, applies only to a complaint filed on or after the
- 9 effective date of this Act. A complaint filed before the effective
- 10 date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately
- 11 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in
- 12 effect for that purpose.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
