A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the comparison of quality of learning indicators for 3 certain schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.051(b), Education Code is amended to read as follows: 6 (b) Performance on the indicators adopted under this 7 section shall be compared to state-established standards. 8 The degree of change from one school year to the next in performance on 9 each indicator adopted under this section shall also be considered. 10 11 Students who attend multi-campus drop-out prevention programs 12 housed on one campus shall, for the purposes of these indicators, be considered students of the school the student would normally 13 14 attend. The indicators must be based on information that is disaggregated with respect to race, ethnicity, sex, 15 and socioeconomic status and must include: 16 (1) the results of assessment instruments required 17 18 under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (1), aggregated by grade level and subject area; 19 Subsection (b)(2) as amended by Acts 2001, 77th Leg., ch. 20 21 725, Sec. 4 22 (2) dropout and completion rates; Subsection (b)(2) as amended by Acts 2001, 77th Leg., ch. 23 834, Sec. 10 24

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H.B. No. 2449 (2) dropout rates, including dropout rates and district completion rates for grade levels 9 through 12;

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(3) student attendance rates;

4 (4) the percentage of graduating students who attain 5 scores on the secondary exit-level assessment instruments required 6 under Subchapter B that are equivalent to a passing score on the 7 test instrument required under Section 51.306;

8 (5) the percentage of graduating students who meet the 9 course requirements established for the recommended high school 10 program by State Board of Education rule;

(6) the results of the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT), the American College Test, articulated postsecondary degree programs described by Section 61.852, and certified workforce training programs described by Chapter 311, Labor Code;

15 (7) the number of students, aggregated by grade level, 16 provided accelerated instruction under Section 28.0211(c), the 17 results of assessments administered under that section, the number of students promoted through the grade placement committee process 18 under Section 28.0211, the subject of the assessment instrument on 19 which each student failed to perform satisfactorily, and the 20 performance of those students in the school year following that 21 promotion on the assessment instruments required under Section 22 23 39.023;

(8) for students who have failed to perform
satisfactorily on an assessment instrument required under Section
39.023(a) or (c), the numerical progress of those students on
subsequent assessment instruments required under those sections,

14 (10) any other indicator the State Board of Education 15 adopts.

16 (11) the percentage of students of limited English 17 proficiency exempted from the administration of an assessment 18 instrument under Sections 39.027(a)(3) and (4).

19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
