BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. rehabilitation financed by bonds issued under Section 55.17(e)(3) 1 2 (4), 55.1713-55.1718, 55.1721-55.1728, [or] 55.174, 55.1734(e), except that the board shall review all construction, 3 repair, or rehabilitation to be financed by bonds issued under 4 those sections to determine whether the construction, 5 6 rehabilitation, or repair meets the standards adopted by board rule 7 for cost, efficiency, and space use. If the construction, 8 rehabilitation, or repair does not meet those standards, the board 9 shall notify the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the Legislative Budget Board. 10

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
