5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. As soon as practicable after the effective date

7 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall

adopt rules governing all aspects of the management and operation

of a new commercial landfill facility that proposes to accept

nonhazardous industrial solid waste for which a permit has not been

issued on or before the effective date of this Act.

12 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Commission on Environmental

Quality shall suspend the permitting process for any pending

application for a permit for a new commercial landfill facility

that proposes to accept nonhazardous industrial solid waste until

16 the rules adopted under Section 1 of this Act take effect.

17 (b) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall

provide that the rules adopted under Section 1 of this Act apply to

every application for a permit for a new commercial landfill

facility that proposes to accept nonhazardous industrial solid

waste that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act and

22 every application for a permit for a new commercial landfill

facility that proposes to accept nonhazardous industrial solid

24 waste that is pending on the effective date of this Act.

(c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality may allow an applicant who filed such an application that is pending on the effective date of this Act to amend the application to conform to the rules adopted under Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

9 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
