1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a council to oversee the implementation
3	of statewide integrated public safety wireless communications
4	systems for state agencies for public safety and homeland security
5	purposes.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Sections 411.0105 and 411.0106 to read as
9	follows:
10	Sec. 411.0105. PUBLIC SAFETY WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS
11	COUNCIL. (a) In this section, "public safety spectrum" means any
12	radio frequency spectrum administered under Part 90 of the Federal
13	Communications Commission Regulations for operation of
14	interoperable and general-use radio communications systems for
15	<pre>public safety purposes in the state.</pre>
16	(b) In this section, "infrastructure equipment" means the
17	underlying permanent equipment required for wireless
18	communications systems designed to facilitate public safety
19	wireless communications interoperability.
20	(c) The Public Safety Wireless Communications Council is
21	composed of the administrative head of each of the following
22	entities or that person's designee.
23	(1) the department;
24	(2) Texas Department of Transportation;

1	(3) Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
2	(4) Parks and Wildlife Department;
3	(5) Texas Forest Service;
4	(6) Texas Youth Commission;
5	(7) Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission; and
6	(8) Sheriff's Association of Texas.
7	(d) The Council Shall:
8	(1) advise the department in the development and
9	administration of a strategic plan to implement statewide
10	integrated public safety wireless communications systems for state
11	agencies and other state public safety entities which are members
12	of the entities referenced under subdivision (6) that promotes
13	interoperability and other shared uses of the public safety
14	spectrum within and between local, state, and federal agencies and
15	that is consistent with the regulations and decisions of the
16	Federal Communications Commission;
17	(2) develop a model memorandum of understanding that
18	sets forth the general terms of agreement for interoperability and
19	other shared uses of the public safety spectrum and infrastructure
20	between a state agency and a local or federal agency;
21	(3) research and identify the wireless communications
22	equipment necessary to facilitate interoperability and other
23	shared uses of the public safety spectrum within and between local,
24	state, and federal agencies;
25	(4) research and identify state agencies that need new
26	or upgraded wireless communications equipment to be capable of
27	participating in interoperability and other shared uses of the

- 1 public safety spectrum within and between local, state, and federal 2 agencies; 3 (5) advise the department in the development and 4 administration of a program to purchase wireless communications 5 equipment for state agencies in compliance with the strategic plan 6 developed under (d)(1); and 7 (6) assist representatives of the following entities in developing specific agreements for interoperability and other 8 9 shared uses of the public safety spectrum between local state and federal agencies that operate wireless systems on the public safety 10 spectrum and that have the capability for interoperability or other 11 12 shared uses: 13 (A) the Texas Police Chiefs Association; 14 (B) the Texas Fire Chief's Association; 15 (C) the Texas Association of Counties: 16 (D) the Texas Municipal League; and 17 (E) the State Firemen & Fire Marshall's 18 Association. 19 (7) oversee the design and implementation of statewide integrated public safety wireless communications systems as 20 21 identified in the strategic plan required in Subsection (d)(1). 22 (8) use state funds and federal funds received from the federal government for homeland security and appropriated in 23 24 the General Appropriations Act for the design, implementation, and maintenance of statewide integrated public safety wireless 25 26 communications systems.

(e) To obtain assistance or information necessary for the

- 3 (f) Not later than September 1 of each year, the council
- 4 shall provide to the legislature a report on the status of its
- 5 duties under this section.
- 6 (g) Not later than September 1, 2004, the council shall
- 7 provide a report to the legislature detailing the steps necessary
- 8 and the projected costs for implementing and maintaining statewide
- 9 <u>integrated public safety wireless communications systems as</u>
- identified in the strategic plan required in Subsection (d)(1).
- 11 (h) The council shall oversee the design, implementation
- 12 and maintenance of statewide integrated public safety wireless
- 13 communications systems as identified in the strategic plan required
- in Subsection (d)(1).
- 15 (i) The administration, staffing and reporting requirements
- of the council shall be the responsibility of the department
- 17 (j) The council is subject to chapter 2110, except that
- 18 Section 2110.002 does not apply.
- 19 SECTION 2. The Public Safety Wireless Communications
- 20 Council created by Section 411.0105, Government Code, as added by
- 21 this act:
- (1) shall hold its first meeting in accordance with
- that section not later than December 1, 2003; and
- 24 (2) Shall provide to the legislature its first report
- on the progress of its duties and functions under that section not
- later than September 1, 2004.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
