## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of minimum levels of water
- 3 conservation in water conservation plans.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 11.1271, Water Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (c) Beginning January 15, 2005, all water conservation
- 9 plans required under this section must include specific, quantified
- 10 3-year, 5-year, and 10-year targets for water savings. The entity
- 11 preparing the plan shall establish the targets. Targets must
- 12 include goals for unaccounted for water and goals for municipal use
- in gallons per capita per day.
- 14 (d) The commission and the board jointly shall identify
- quantified target goals for water conservation that water suppliers
- 16 and other entities may use as guidelines in preparing water
- 17 conservation plans. Goals established under this subsection are
- 18 not enforceable requirements.
- 19 (e) The commission and board jointly shall develop model
- 20 water conservation programs for different types of water suppliers
- 21 that suggest best management practices for achieving the highest
- 22 practicable levels of water conservation and efficiency achievable
- 23 for each specific type of water supplier.
- 24 (f) The commission shall adopt rules establishing criteria

- and deadlines for submission of water conservation plans, including
- 2 any required amendments, and for submission of implementation
- 3 <u>reports</u>.
- 4 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2004, the Texas
- 5 Commission on Environmental Quality and the Texas Water Development
- 6 Board shall take the actions necessary to comply with Section
- 7 11.1271, Water Code, as amended by this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. (a) This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 9 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 10 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 11 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 12 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 13 (b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 11.1271,
- 14 Water Code, applies to a holder of an existing permit, certified
- 15 filing, or certificate of adjudication as described in Section
- 16 11.1271(b), Water Code, regardless of whether the permit, certified
- 17 filing, or certificate of adjudication is obtained before, on, or
- 18 after that date.
