	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to authorizing certain counties to exercise certain
3	regulatory authority in the unincorporated area of the county;
4	providing a penalty.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 232, Local Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Subchapter F to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER F. REGULATION OF USE, LOCATION, AND CONSTRUCTION IN
9	BORDER COUNTIES
10	Sec. 232.121. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
11	to a county that is adjacent to an international border.
12	Sec. 232.122. AREA SUBJECT TO REGULATION. This subchapter
13	applies only to the unincorporated area of the county.
14	Sec. 232.123. EXEMPTIONS. An order adopted under this
15	subchapter does not apply to a building, other structure, or land
16	used for:
17	(1) recreational or agricultural purposes; or
18	(2) business, industrial, or residential purposes, if
19	the owner has been issued a permit for that use by a state or federal
20	agency.
21	Sec. 232.124. MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE PREVAILS OVER COUNTY
22	ORDER. If an order adopted under this subchapter conflicts with an
23	ordinance of a municipality, the municipal ordinance prevails
24	within the municipality's jurisdiction to the extent of the

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1	<u>conflict.</u>
2	Sec. 232.125. EXISTING COUNTY AUTHORITY UNAFFECTED. The
3	authority granted under this subchapter does not affect the
4	authority of the commissioners court to adopt an order or ordinance
5	under other law.
6	Sec. 232.126. REGULATORY AUTHORITY. The commissioners
7	court of the county may adopt an order to regulate the following
8	matters if the grant of that authority to the commissioners court is
9	approved at an election under this subchapter:
10	(1) the construction of buildings and other
11	structures; and
12	(2) the use of land and the location and use of
13	buildings and other structures for business, industrial, or
14	residential purposes.
15	Sec. 232.127. PETITION. (a) The voters may file a petition
16	with the county clerk to initiate an election under this
17	subchapter. The petition must:
18	(1) be signed by at least five percent of the
19	registered voters in the unincorporated area of the county;
20	(2) include the voter registration number, printed
21	name, and residence address, including the zip code, of each person
22	signing the petition;
23	(3) include beside each person's signature the date
24	the person signed the petition; and
25	(4) include a statement located on each page of the
26	petition preceding the space reserved for signatures worded
27	substantially similar to the following: "This petition is to

1	request that an election be held in (name of county) to consider
2	whether to authorize the county to regulate in the unincorporated
3	area of the county:
4	(A) the construction of buildings and other
5	structures; and
6	(B) the use of land and the location and use of
7	buildings and other structures for business, industrial, or
8	residential purposes."
9	(b) On or before the 10th day after the date a petition is
10	filed with the county clerk, the county clerk shall verify the
11	petition. A person's signature may not be counted if the person
12	fails to include the date of signing or if the date of signing is
13	before the 30th day before the date the petition is filed.
14	Sec. 232.128. ELECTION. (a) The commissioners court shall
15	order and hold an election in the county on the question of granting
16	the commissioners court the authority described by Section 232.126
17	<u>if:</u>
18	(1) the commissioners court determines regulation is
19	necessary to protect the public health, safety, or welfare; or
20	(2) a petition is verified under Section 232.127.
21	(b) In the election, the ballot shall be prepared to permit
22	voting for or against the proposition: "Granting (name of county)
23	the authority to regulate in the unincorporated area of the county:
24	(1) the construction of buildings and other
25	structures; and
26	(2) the use of land and the location and use of
27	buildings and other structures for business, industrial, or

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1	residential purposes."
2	(c) If a majority of the votes received on the question at
3	the election approve the grant of authority, the commissioners
4	court may adopt an order under Section 232.126.
5	Sec. 232.129. DISTRICTS. (a) The commissioners court may
6	divide the unincorporated area of the county into districts of a
7	number, shape, and size the court considers best for carrying out
8	this subchapter.
9	(b) In dividing the unincorporated area under Subsection
10	(a), no portion of an election precinct may be located in more than
11	one district.
12	(c) The commissioners court may exercise the authority
13	provided by this subchapter in each district.
14	Sec. 232.130. FEES. The commissioners court by order may
15	set fees that relate to the administration of this subchapter and
16	that are in amounts sufficient to cover the costs of administering
17	this subchapter.
18	Sec. 232.131. GENERAL ENFORCEMENT PROVISION. The
19	commissioners court may adopt an order to enforce an order adopted
20	under this subchapter.
21	Sec. 232.132. INJUNCTION. The county, in a suit brought by
22	the county attorney or other prosecuting attorney representing the
23	county in the district court, is entitled to appropriate injunctive
24	relief to prevent the violation or threatened violation of an order
25	adopted under this subchapter from continuing or occurring.
26	Sec. 232.133. PENALTY. A person commits an offense if the
27	person violates a restriction or prohibition imposed by an order

1	adopted under this subchapter. An offense under this section is a
2	<u>Class C misdemeanor.</u>
3	SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 232, Local Government
4	Code, is amended to read as follows:
5	CHAPTER 232. COUNTY REGULATION OF SUBDIVISIONS AND PROPERTY
6	DEVELOPMENT
7	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
