6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education Code, is

7 amended by adding Section 55.17421 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 55.17421. THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS SYSTEM; ADDITIONAL

REVENUE BONDS. (a) In addition to the other authority granted by

this subchapter, the board of regents of The University of Texas

System may acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate,

enlarge, or equip property, buildings, structures, facilities,

- 2 The amount of a pledge made under this subsection may not be reduced
- 3 or abrogated while the bonds for which the pledge is made, or bonds

- 6 meet its obligations under this section, the board may transfer
- funds among institutions, branches, and entities of The University

- 17 55.17421, except that the board shall review all real property to be

- 20 efficiency, and space use. If the property does not meet those
- 21 standards, the board shall notify the governor, the lieutenant
- 22 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 23 Legislative Budget Board.
- SECTION 3. Section 61.058(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (b) This section does not apply to construction, repair, or
- 27 rehabilitation financed by bonds issued under Section 55.17(e)(3)

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- or (4), 55.1713-55.1718, 55.1721-55.1728, [or] 55.174, or 1 55.17421, except that the board shall review all construction, 2 repair, or rehabilitation to be financed by bonds issued under 3 4 sections to determine whether the construction, rehabilitation, or repair meets the standards adopted by board rule 5 6 for cost, efficiency, and space use. If the construction, rehabilitation, or repair does not meet those standards, the board 7 8 shall notify the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of 9 the house of representatives, and the Legislative Budget Board.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
