11SUBCHAPTER A. PROHIBITED ACTS RELATING TO ABORTION12SECTION 4. The chapter heading of Chapter 170, Health and13Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

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CHAPTER 170. [PROHIBITED ACTS REGARDING] ABORTION

SECTION 5. Section 245.007, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 245.007. FEES. The board shall set fees imposed by this chapter in amounts reasonable and necessary to defray the cost of administering this chapter <u>and Subchapter B, Chapter 170</u>.

20 SECTION 6. The Texas Department of Health shall develop and 21 make available the form required by Section 170.051, Health and 22 Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than December 1, 2003.

23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and 24 applies only to an abortion performed on or after January 1, 2004.
